McQuaid Ready For Bradford, Pa.

Twelve players had a hand in setting a new school scoring record for McQuaid Jesuit High last Saturday at Batavia as the Knights romped over Notre Dame High School, 56-6.

THIS SATURDAY McQuaid, now 3-1, will make its last home start of the campaign against what is expected to be a decidedly tougher opposition in an invading Bradford (Pa.) Central team.

The Knights will go into that game with confidences restored by its performance at Batavia. Eight plays after the opening kickoff they had their first score, utilizing straight line, and shaking fullback Jim Pezzulo loose for the first of his three touchdowns on a five-yard spurt through the left side.

Halfback Bill Bruckel is next on the production line, and his contribution to the record was a 50-yard scamper around left and on which he simply ran past the ND defenders who were angling over to head him off.

Pezzulo was back again in the second period with a 35-yard breakaway, and junior end Joe Miller, getting his first crack at the offensive assignment, latched onto a 14-yard pass from quarterback Dick Spies to account for the fourth touchdown.

Pezzulo opened the second-half onslaught with a nine-yard scoring run climaxing a short drive, and junior Joe Conellan, operating at defensive halfback, made it number six with a side-line sprint on an intercepted pass.

The seventh and eighth touchdowns were both "special," being scored by punters who had never before registered a

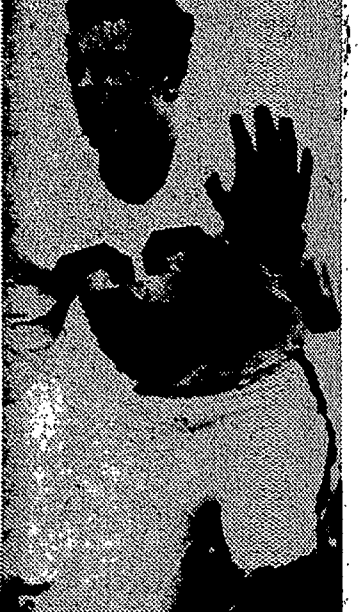
