

## Bishop Kearney To Mark Jubilee at Cathedral

Bishop Kearney will celebrate his silver jubilee of installation as spiritual shepherd of the Rochester Diocese at a Mass of Thanksgiving in Sacred Heart Cathedral Sunday, Nov. 11, at 4:30 p.m.

Pope John this week granted him permission to leave Rome and the ecumenical Council now in session at the Vatican to celebrate the anniversary with his people.

The Bishop is expected to arrive in Rochester early this coming week.

He was installed as Rochester's fifth Bishop in solemn rites in Sacred Heart Cathedral on Nov. 11, 1937.

## DCCW Head, Delegation To Attend Detroit Meet

Geneva — Mrs. Julian G. Humiston of Fatima Farm, Stanley, president of the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, will attend the 31st Convention of the National Council of Catholic Women as a voting delegate of the Rochester Council.

THE CONVENTION will be Nov. 3-7 at Cobo Convention Hall Center in Detroit, Mich. Theme of the convention is "The Christian In A Changing World."

Mrs. Humiston will fly to Detroit on Saturday morning, Nov. 3, to attend a special meeting of all archdiocesan and diocesan presidents representing over ten million Catholic Women from the fifty states.

Miss Frances Merriman of Geneva, corresponding secretary of the diocesan council, will accompany Mrs. Humiston. Miss Merriman will be the voting delegate from St. Francis de Sales Parish in Geneva.

The complete delegation from the Rochester affiliations will include: Miss Stella T. Zawadzki, St. Stanislaus, past president of the council; Miss Josephine Zawadzki, assistant treasurer of the diocesan council; Mrs. Thomas W. McWhinney, Rochester, vice-chairman

of International Relations Committee; Mrs. Robert D. Waterman, Ontario, diocesan chairman of Organization and Development Committee; Mrs. Victor Fischer, Victor, deanery chairman of Organization and Development Committee; Miss Sophie Cudjilo, diocesan historian; Mrs. Humbert Solon, deanery president of St. Suben County Council.

Rev. E. Leo McMannus, diocesan moderator from St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, will attend the convention at special meetings for moderators and workshop panel during the convention. Father McMannus will be accompanied by Rev. James F. O'Connell, pastor of St. Mary's, Waterloo. Father O'Connell is moderator of the O-S-Y Deanery Council.

The convention will close with a formal banquet Wednesday when the new officers of the national council will be introduced. The Rochester delegation will return on Thursday, Nov. 8.

## St. John Of Rochester

### Perinton Drive Opens

Parishioners of the newly-established St. John of Rochester parish, Perinton, will be visited during the next two Sunday afternoons, Nov. 4 and 11, for fund pledges toward the proposed construction of a church-school building.

The Rev. John W. LeVeque, pastor, announced last week that site preparations are under way on a plot at Palmyra Road (Route 31) and Wickford Way, and that the new church and school will be ready for occupancy in September, 1963.

ST. JOHN OF ROCHESTER School, to be staffed by the Sisters of Mercy, will open with Grades 1, 2, 3 and 4.

More than 200 men of the parish have been organized to conduct the parishwide canvass for pledges. Parishioners will be asked to estimate what they will give toward construction costs over a three-year period beginning in January.

Father LeVeque said total costs of land and construction of a rectory and the combination church-school building will be in excess of \$300,000. Construction of the rectory is in progress on Wickford Way, with completion scheduled in January.

Forty members of the advanced solicitation committee, who will call on a portion of the parishioners Sunday afternoon,

will have their kickoff dinner at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 3, in the Maplewood Inn. The Rev. William M. Roche, diocesan superintendent of schools, will be the speaker.

All committeemen will attend a pep rally at 8 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 8, in the Bushnell's Basin Firehouse. Tom Decker, WRROC-TV news director, will be principal speaker, and entertainment will be provided by members of the Liederkranz Chorus.

More than 180 members of the general solicitation committee will have their kickoff dinner at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 10, in the Valley Echo Inn. Principal speaker will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James C. Mc-

Aniff, vicar general of the Diocese.

COCHAIRMAN of the executive committee for the fund campaign are R. Bruce Carson and Leon G. Lesniak. Heading the advanced solicitation group are George J. Alfieri and John W. Rutledge.

St. John of Rochester parish is bounded by St. Louis Church, Pittsford, and the Church of the Assumption, Fairport. Sunday Masses for parishioners are being celebrated in the Immaculate Heart of Mary Chapel, Bushnell's Basin. Father LeVeque is residing temporarily at 30 Littlebrook Dr., Pittsford.

### To Open New School

In an announcement made last Sunday at the Masses in St. Charles Borromeo church, Elmira Heights, Father Joseph G. Merkel, pastor, told of plans for the opening of a parish school in September of 1963.

THE SCHOOL will open with grades one, two and three with the addition of a grade each year until all eight grades are in operation.

This is the ninth parochial

school to open in the Elmira area.

Teaching staff of the school will be Sisters of Mercy. Mother Bride, General Superior of the Sisters of Mercy has agreed to provide three Sisters for the opening classes.

The three temporary classrooms will be located in the present catechetical center and church hall. Movable partitions

will separate the grades and at the same time permit the use of the hall for Society meetings or other parish activities.

It is planned to use the present rectory for the Sisters Convent and the future rectory will be the residence immediately North of the church recently acquired. Alterations to both homes are scheduled for next summer.
