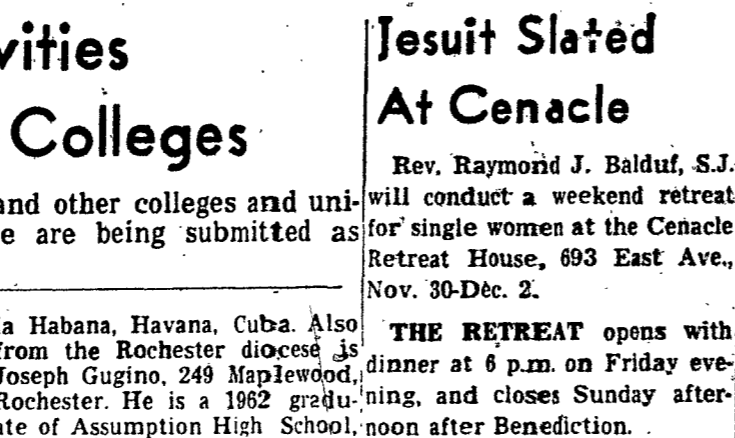
THE RETREAT opens with dinner at 6 p.m. on Friday evening, and closes Sunday afternoon after Benediction.

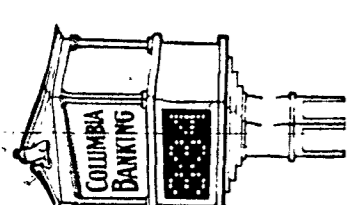
