FIVE ROUNDS of debating are scheduled during the two-day tournament. The subject to be debated will be this year's national college debate topic: "That the Non-Communist Nations of the World Should Form an Economic Community."

The rotating gavel trophy symbol of the Fisher forum will be awarded to the winning school. Three wins are necessary for permanent possession of the gavel. In addition, permanent trophies will also be awarded to the first and second place schools, and also the best affirmative and negative teams.

The Fisher Forum Debate Tournament is annually one of the first intercollegiate varsity debate tournaments of the year. Among previous winners
