Batavia Looms As McQuaid Foe

With its fourth victory and second straight high-scoring spree, a 46 triumph over Bradford (Pa.) Central Christian H.S., behind it, McQuaid Jesuit High turns this week to a future that promises, if not exactly blood, sweat and tears, at least no easy victories.

Next on the agenda is Batavia High School, set for Friday night at Batavia; and a week later, there's an undefeated Canisius High foe on tap over in Buffalo.
