

Bp. Kearney High Wins Running Test

McQuaid Jesuit High regained its varsity title, and Bishop Kearney High captured freshman honors, in the annual running of the Rochester Diocesan Cross-Country Championships at St. Anthony of Padua, Watkins Glen, last Saturday.

The Knights of McQuaid, led by captain Mike Connor's record-breaking performance, tallied 29 points to top Aquinas, which had 35, and Padua, whose improving squad posted a 64 total. In the freshman division, Kearney's blue-shirted Kings won with an impressive 33 points. McQuaid (57) was second, Padua (67) was third, and Aquinas (85) fourth.

Connor, in winning by 150 yards, set a new course record of 12:02, nine seconds better than the 1961 mark of Aquinas' Tim Boland. McQuaid's Paul Troskoski, who set the early pace, finished fourth, Dick Lenhard sixth, Brad Jones eighth, and Frank Eismont tenth to complete the winning team.

AQUINAS, THE defending champion, packed Bob Bossert (2), Dave Crommiller (3), and John Heveron (5) into the first five; but the McQuaid threesome of Lenhard, Jones, and Eismont, along with Padua runners Dick Bonk (7), Pete Kraftinski (9), and Steve Smolenski (11), finished strongly to get home ahead of the remaining Irish scorers.

Kearney's winning team was made up of Dick Brown (2), John Gefell (3), Joe Piccarro (8), Bruce O'Neill (11), and Pat Maxwell (12). Individual honors went to McQuaid's Jerry Abbott, who beat Brown by less than 10 yards over a hilly 1.5 mile course. Gefell edged McQuaid's Gary Valby for third place, and Ed Hyland of Padua took fifth.

It was the first time in the championships' 3-year history that a freshman race was held. Arrangements for the meet were once again handled by Rev. Emil Rakowski, O.F.M., Padua athletic director. Following the races, an awards dinner for runners, coaches and officials was held in Watkins Glen.
