**Old Organ,
New Music**

Notre Dame — (NC) — An 87-year-old pipe organ whose music has heralded many memorable events at the University of Notre Dame has been enlarged and transformed into a modern instrument for a new era.

Situated in Sacred Heart Church on the campus, the virtually new organ was recently installed at a cost of approximately \$25,000. The instrument, which includes many components of an organ in use since 1875, consists of three manuals or keyboards and 41 ranks of 2,368 pipes.

Father Patrick H. Maloney, C.S.C., assistant professor of music at the university, collaborated with the manufacturer in its design. The organ is being dedicated Nov. 11.
