Bp. Kearney 6

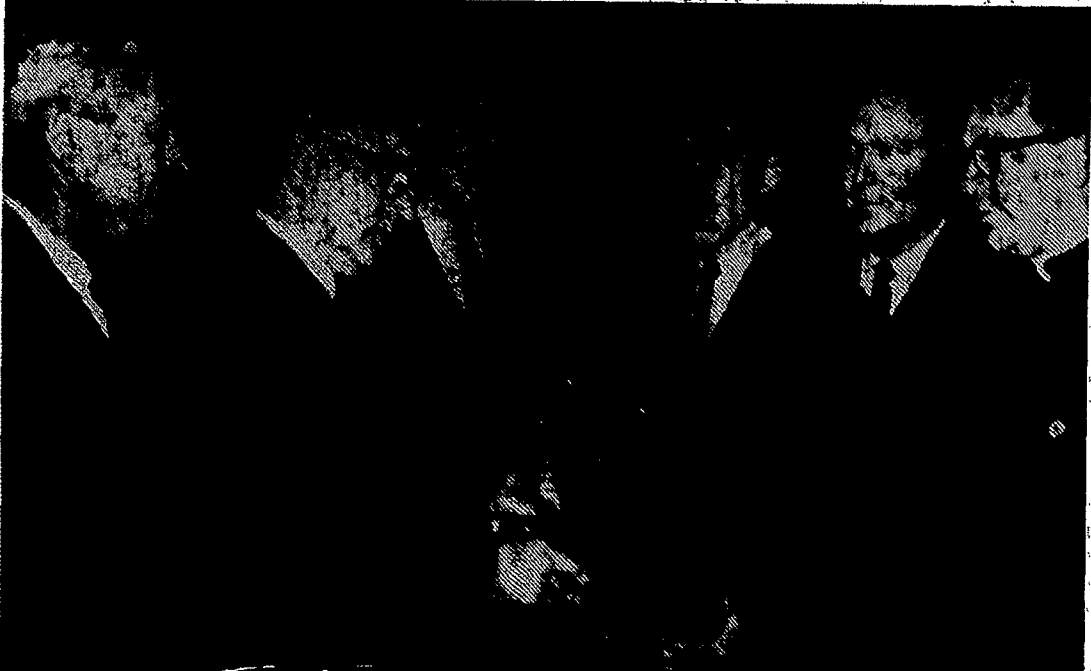

Noonday Book Review Given By Dr. Kelly

"Civilization will probably survive the onslaught of Suburbia," commented Dr. John P. Kelly last week dryly in his critique of Peter Wyden's "Suburbia's Coddled Kids." His analysis was the third in the fall series being offered by the Noonday Book Review on alternate Tuesdays at the Catholic Evidence Library.

"WYDEN'S BOOK" picks up and spotlights many of the defects in suburban family life. Some of these are:

- 1. The growth of 'one-class' societies, with practically all the neighbors being of the same type of educational and economic backgrounds.
2. The patriarchal structure of family life; Father is away from the home most of the time; Mother assumes an ever-growing role.
3. Children are over-protected, over-organized and too often as the author argues, "coddled."

Dr. Kelly, who lives and practices medicine in the suburbs (East Henrietta) noted that Wyden wasn't completely pessimistic, however.
