

McQuaid To Close With Canisius High

Saving its toughest opponent until last, McQuaid Jesuit High's football team will close out its season this Sunday afternoon at Buffalo's War Memorial Stadium against a veteran and un-

defeated Canisius High School eleven. The Knights, a 39-7 loser to Batavia High School in last week's game, are now 4-21. Canisius, with a 4-26 romp over Bishop Ryan as its latest conquest, is 7-0. Last year, the Buffalo squad came to Rochester as the favorite and had to settle for a 13-13 tie. This year both squads are improved, but Canisius will still be viewed as the favorite in its own backyard.

McQuaid, which had to go with only 24 players against Batavia, will have most of its ineligible back in action for the finale, including key men Bill Bruckel, Joe Hallett, and Tom Fuerst. But senior tackle Tom Walther, a top offensive man, sustained an ankle injury in the Batavia debacle that will keep him out of action.

Also missing will be offensive guard Bob Siconolfi, another Batavia casualty.

Nothing went right for the Knights in the Batavia game. Not only were they unable to contain the speedy Blue Devils' high-powered running attack, but their own offensive errors were responsible for three of the Batavia scores.

In the opening quarter, after penalties had bogged down a McQuaid drive, Mike Spicgel boomed a punt out of bounds on Batavia's 5-yard line, apparently putting the home team in a tight spot. It bothered them not a bit, as they demonstrated by driving 95 yards for their first score, a 24-yard run by Sam Guardino getting the 6 points.

On the ensuing kickoff, McQuaid's ball-carrying corps didn't make its move fast enough, and Batavia pounced on the loose pigskin on the Knights' 26. That set up TD number 2, and just before halftime, after an end zone pass had just missed getting McQuaid back into the game, Batavia's Tom Briggs grabbed a deflected Knight aerial and angled 38 yards into the corner of touchdown land.

THE KNIGHTS, down by 20-0 at halftime, kept getting good yardage from fullback Jim Pezzulo, who totaled 93 yards for his evening's work. But the Blue Devils, and notably quarterback Larry Jacobs, did all the scoring until McQuaid went 50 yards for its only touchdown midway through the last period.

Pezzulo was the big galner on the drive, which ended with Dick Spies sneaking over from the 1-foot line. The extra point went to Pezzulo in a pitchout, putting the score at 33-7. It was later when a McQuaid fumble set Batavia up on the 6-yard line.

It was one of the Knights' worst outings on a football field. Closer to full strength this time around, they'll be out to show Canisius the same brand of football that has brought 4 impressive wins.

One of those victories by the way, was over Hornell, which turned around and beat Batavia. Put your slide rule to work on that one.

Aquinas 'B' Harriers Win

Aquinas "B" team repeated its earlier cross-country win over its McQuaid counterpart with a 24-35 decision last week at Maplewood Park. Tom Woods led the Little Irish scores, besting McQuaid's Brian Dougherty in the stretch to take individual honors. Barry McGee followed in third position. Dave Yates was fifth, Tom Scallih seventh, and Dennis Bronka eighth. McQuaid's other two finishers ahead of the decisive Aquinas 4-5 were Henry Hinz in fourth place and Walt Knipper in sixth.

Two weeks ago, the "B" race at McQuaid ended in a 27-38 Aquinas victory.

Aquinas vs. Pittsburgh

Aquinas Little Irish will look to the passing wizardry of quarterback Bill Abel Sunday afternoon when they collide with Pittsburgh city champs, North Catholic, to close out their gridiron season.

It figures, of course, that someone is going to beat the Irish this season, considering the power-packed teams they schedule. Coaches know that it is impossible to get a team up week after week and after the thrilling win over Kingston, Pa. on Oct. 28, it is not surprising that Aquinas fell prey to Bishop Walsh last Friday night. Furthermore, Aquinas' reputation is something like putting the bell on the cat.

"We had hoped to do better of course," said Coach Joe Repko, "especially after such sound performances in our opening games, but losing seven games through injuries was tantamount to graduating a class and on top of that we lost Nacca in the early minutes of the Walsh game. They'll be up for Pittsburgh," Repko said, "just wait and see."

Bill Abel, quarterback, has gained 470 yards in seven games, completing 34 passes with 9 passes caught for a total gain of 119 yards, including one touchdown pass.

Kickoff at Aquinas Memorial Stadium is set for 2 p.m. Featured at half-time will be the famed Aquinas Marching Band in a precision drill.

Lou Spotti and Bill Abel are the leaders of the Aquinas attack, both with 18 points. Helmut Reimann is credited with one touchdown and 13 conversions. Spotti has gained 281 rushing yards for an average of 5.5 yards per carry. Pete Seelos is the leading receiver with 9 passes caught for a total gain of 119 yards, including one touchdown pass.

THE LITTLE IRISH are going to make the big try Sunday. They're full of high hopes, have a revenge motive going for them and will be playing at home.

But it will be doubly tough. One reason is Ted Verihay, rated one of the finest line backers in the whole Pittsburgh area, and Dick Andolina, a triple threat quarterback.

Then, too, the defending city champions smothered tough Mt. Valley High, 21-6. North Catholic will have the revenge motive, too, because last week they lost to Pittsburgh Central, their traditional rivals, 7-6. Chances are they may want to take this blight on their record out on Aquinas.

This will mark the ninth meeting of the two teams. Only once, in 1954, has Aquinas been on the winning side of the score. Last year local fans watched in the rain as a determined and skillfully trained Irish eleven went down fighting, 19-6.

NORTH CATHOLIC is currently Pittsburgh city champs. The Trojans are led by a new coach this year, Bob Colville. Statistically, the visitors will average 183 pounds across the line, 160 in the backfield. The overall starting team averages 175 pounds - five more than Aquinas.

One of the top football-playing graduates of North Catholic is Matt Szkywony of Iowa. His brother Larry, who quarterbacked last year's club against Aquinas is currently playing for the University of Pittsburgh.
