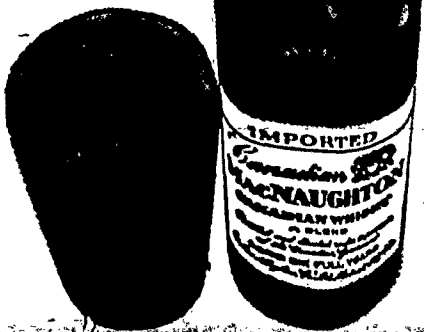

GOD LOVE YOU!

When Pharaoh refused to obey the Divine Command to let the Hebrews go out from Egypt, the land of slavery, God sent plagues after plagues upon the country. Pharaoh made promises, but always broke them. Finally, God sent the plague of darkness. Pharaoh relented and said to Moses: "Go and sacrifice to the Lord and take your children with you, only leave your flocks and herds behind."

Notice the compromise which Pharaoh demanded. The flocks and herds of this pastoral people constituted a principal part of what they owned; these were their earthly possessions. The issue raised by Pharaoh's demand was, therefore, whether or not God has title to all that we have.

Moses refused to accept the compromise on the grounds that all of us are nothing but stewards of any wealth that we have. Furthermore, all of our possessions are to be made available for sacrifice. Moses said to Pharaoh: "Nay, thou must let us take victims with us, if we are to offer the Lord our God burnt-sacrifice."

Recently there came to our attention a letter from a father who has six children and teaches school. His salary is much less than he once earned working in a factory, and yet, recognizing the stewardship of his wealth, he gives twenty-seven per cent of it to the Lord. As he put it: "We may do without many things which we think are necessities, but we enjoy it because many will hear of Our Lord in the Missions who otherwise might not. Each moment we enjoy bountiful and multiplied blessings of Our Lord and Savior. God blesses our stewardship."

In gratitude for any blessings that you have received, may we ask you during the Thanksgiving season to set aside at least a penny a day for the Missions with the prayer: "I do this out of love for Thee, O Lord." Newman Club Meets At Corning College

Corning — Twenty members, attending an organizing meeting of the Newman Club of Corning Community College last week, were told that "the Ecumenical Council in Rome was called primarily to update the church hierarchy called by, and under the direction of, the Pope. 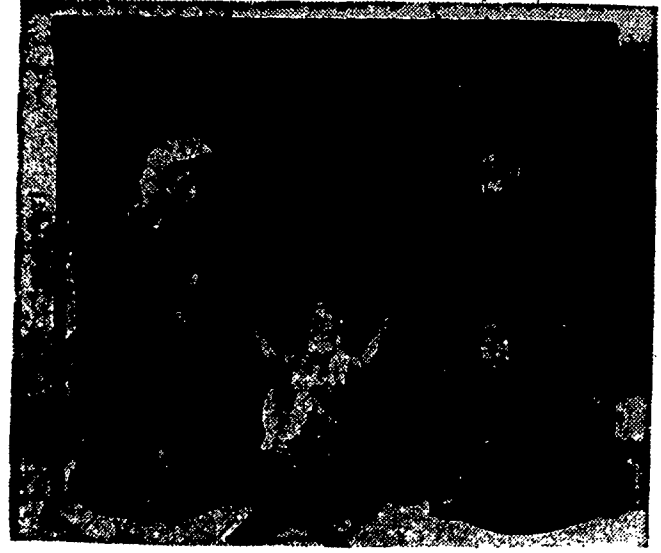
