## CU Offers Players Plan

University PLAYERS, a non-profit theatrical corporation of Washington, D.C., which operates National PLAYERS Touring Company, Olney Theatre in Olney, Maryland and St. Michael's Playhouse in Winooski Park, Vermont, announces its 1963 PLAYERS' PLAN auditions.

PLAYERS' PLAN is a new Grant-in-Aid program of training plus employment for actors. The Plan provides talented actors with advanced training in the Speech and Drama Department of Catholic University plus practical experience in classical acting as salaried members of National PLAYERS, the country's leading national repertory company.

National PLAYERS, a company of approximately 16, travels each year in 36 different states throughout the U.S. from October to May presenting productions of two major classics. The company has performed in New York's Carnegie Hall Playhouse, has made 8 tours abroad and has been received at the White House by Presidents Truman, Eisenhower and Kennedy.

Actors selected on the basis of personal interview, audition and exceptional recommendations and background are contracted for a 2-year period. They receive a \$1000 grant for tuition as graduate students for a year of study at the Speech and Drama Department of Catholic University, which boasts one of the finest University Theatres in the country as well as an outstanding course of study, after which they become members of the National PLAYERS Touring Company. Renewals for an additional 2-year plan can be negotiated if mutually agreeable.
