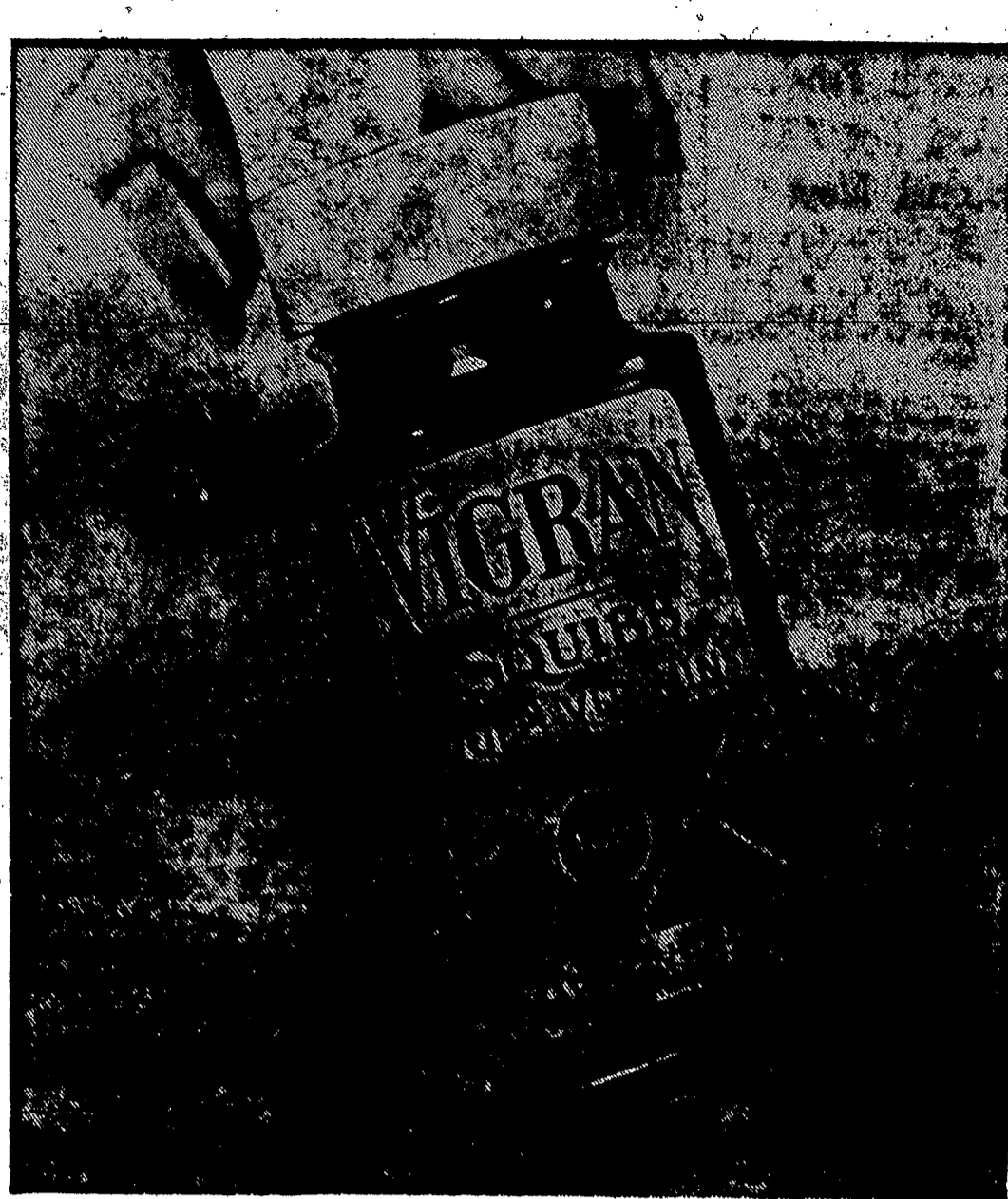

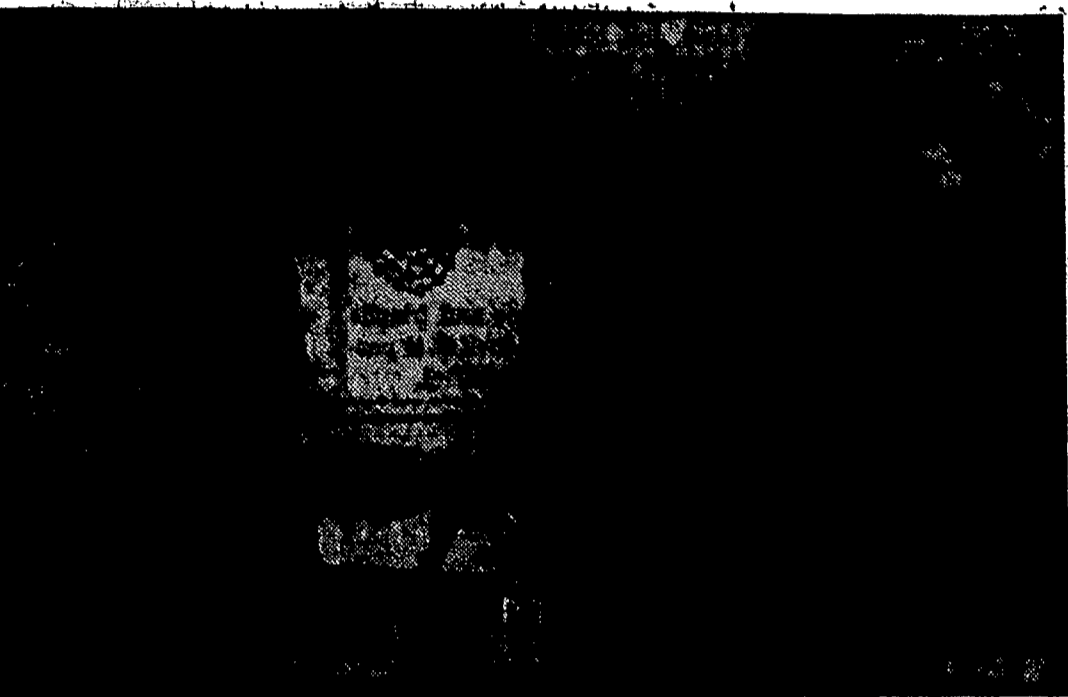

Legion Women Sponsor Hospital Gift Shop

Seventh District, American Legion Auxiliary will set up "The Gift Shop" at the Canandaigua Veterans Hospital, the week of Nov. 26th, with Mrs. Herman Franz of Rochester as chairman.

"The Gift Shop" as it is called, dates back to 1939 in New York State and grew out of the need for assisting hospitalized veterans to maintain closer ties with their families. In establishing the gift shops annually in all Veterans Hospitals across the nation, the American Legion Auxiliary set up a store, to which the hospital patients come to select Christmas gifts for their relatives.

The Auxiliary provides all types of articles, including jewelry, toilet articles, lingerie and many other types of gifts for men, women and children with no cost to the veteran. After he has selected his gifts, he gives the names and addresses of the recipients to the Auxiliary women, who gift wrap, address and mail the packages for him.

Funds for this purpose are derived from the sale of poppies and in this way, make it possible for the hospitalized veteran to remember his family at Christmastime. For those patients who are unable to come to the shop, gifts are placed on carts and Auxiliary women make the rounds of the wards to take the "shop" to the veteran.

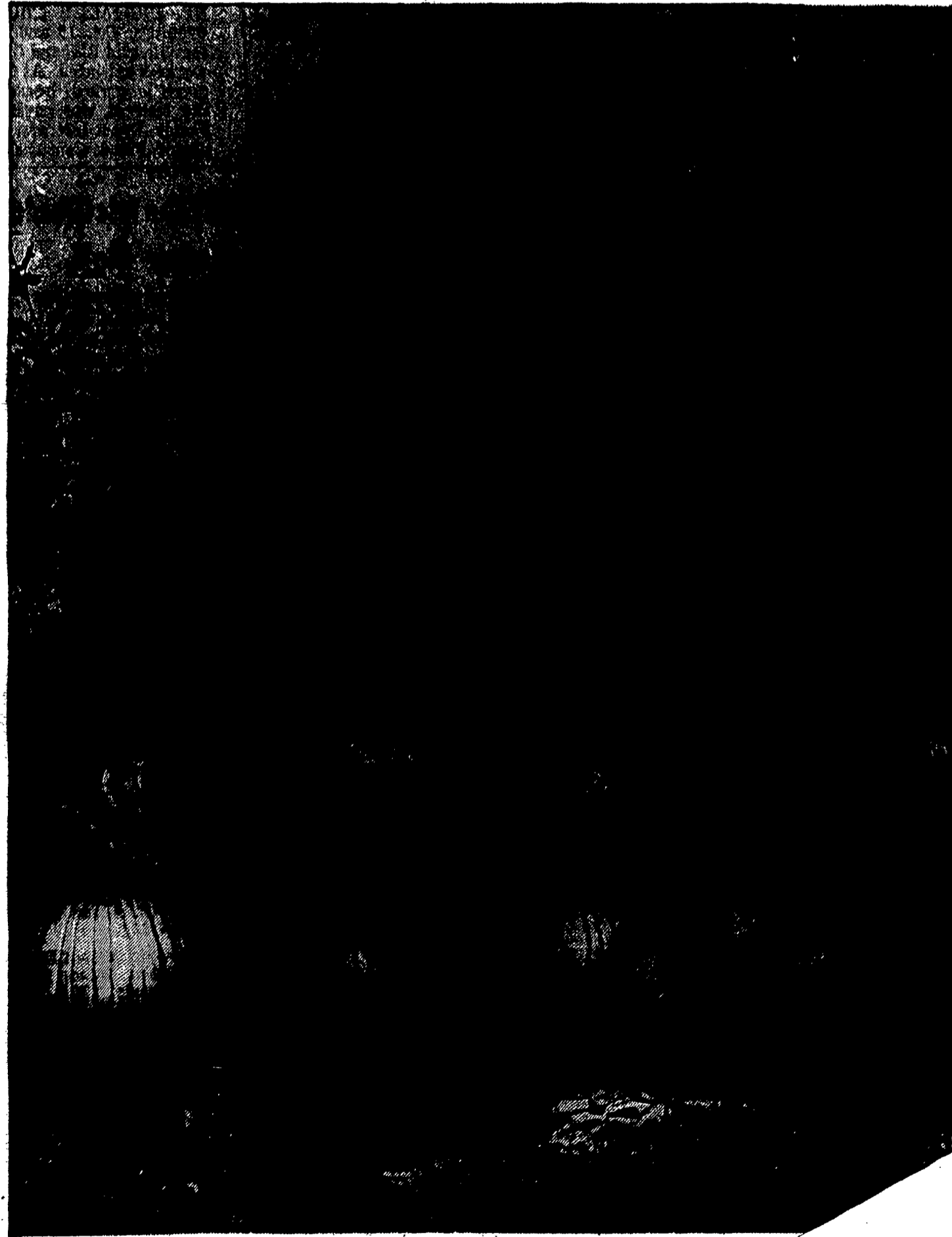
