## Pre-Canceled Post Card Due Jan. 1

After January 1, 1963, the Post Office will offer a new postal card which will be pre-canceled.

John G. Bittner said the new cards will be on gleaming white paperstock to replace the buff color used for many years. A light purple 4-cent Abraham Lincoln stamp will be used on the cards.

Tests conducted in four major cities for an extended period proved that the bulk of two billion cards purchased each year are used by business firms for advertising purposes. Pre-canceling of these cards will result in appreciable savings to the Post Office and improve mail delivery service since these cards will bypass one complete postal operation.

Parents, alumnae and friends of the college are invited to participate in the festivities.



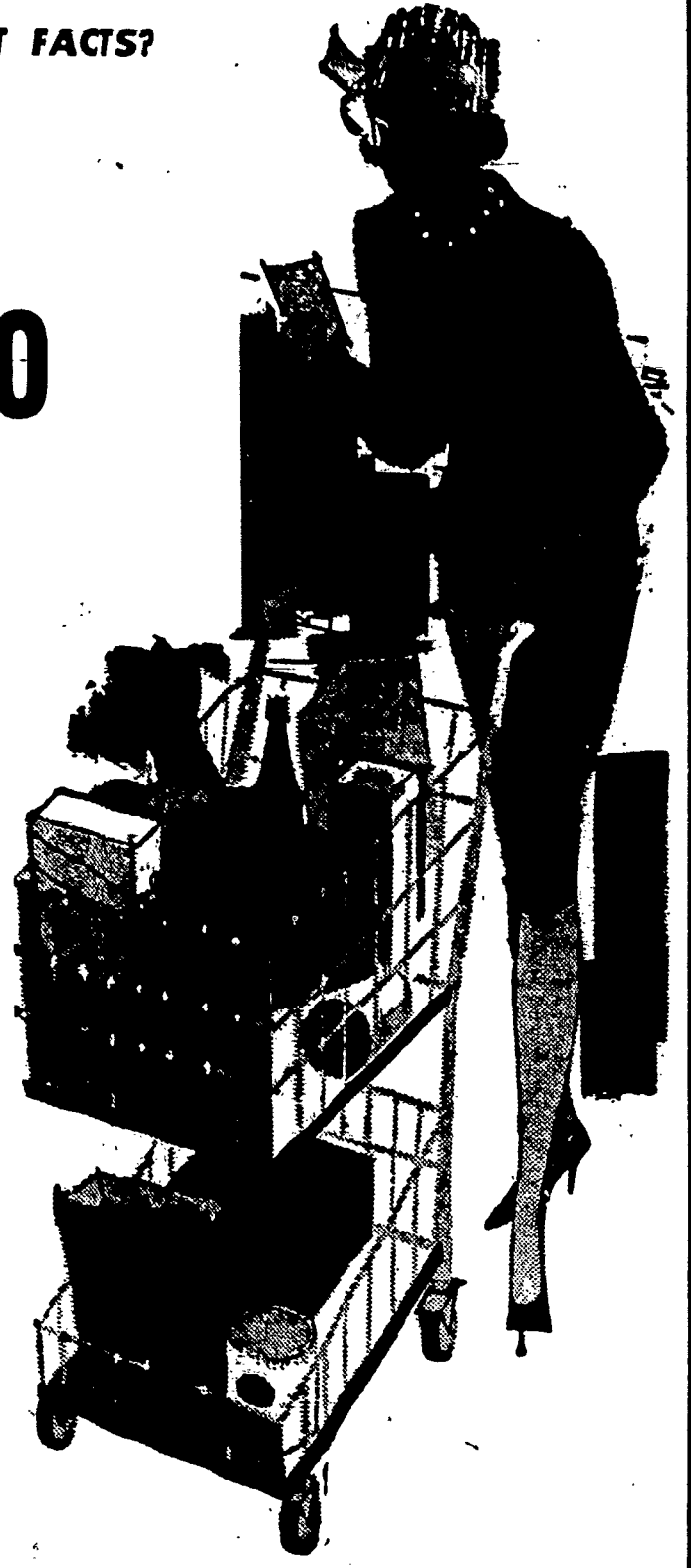
## Pastor Given Festival Check
