

Charles Goetz, Photographer Requiem Held

Funeral Mass for Charles L. Goetz, widely known portrait photographer, was offered in Blessed Sacrament Church, Wednesday, Nov. 21 by Rev. Joseph T. Maloney.

Mr. Goetz, 80, of 251 Munda Blvd., died of a heart ailment, Nov. 19, 1962 in Park Ave. Hospital.

MR. GOETZ had operated a photographic studio, first on Clinton Ave. North and later on East Ave. from the time he was 20 until his retirement about 1940.

During that period he had photographed Bishops of Rochester which he donated to St. Bernard's Seminary. His was one of the first photographic studios in the city.

A native of Rochester, Mr. Goetz attended St. Joseph's School. His wife, Elizabeth, died about 10 years ago.

He is survived by a son, John G. Goetz, his grandson, Wheeler Van Brocklin and several nieces and nephews. (His sister, Mrs. Arthur Goetz Gysel, survived him but her death occurred on Nov. 23, 1962 and her husband's on Nov. 22.)

Rt. Rev. Msgr. Leslie G. Whalen gave the final blessing in the Chapel of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Arrangements were by John J. Curran Funeral Home.

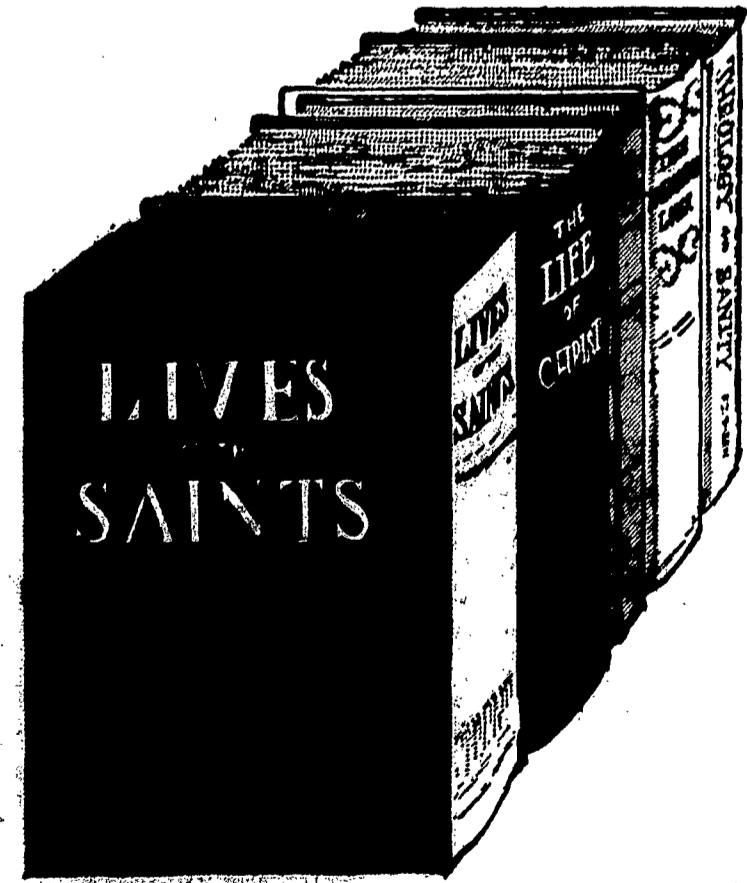
