McQuaid Five Nipped In Opener 39-38

The thin line between victory and defeat in McQuaid Jesuit High's season-opening 39-38 basketball loss to Spencerport on Thanksgiving Eve wasn't actually thin at all. Not unless they're cutting down on the width of foul lines these days.

That's where the Knights saw themselves outscored, 23-6, as they dropped their first game under coach Ken Jones before an overflow crowd at the McQuaid gym.

SPENCERPORT, with three bus loads of fans shouting encouragement, took full advantage of McQuaid's freshly-minted zone defense to pile up its winning margin. McQuaid, though outscoring the Rangers 16-8, in field goals, had difficulty defending in close against the visitors' probing offense and paid dearly for it. Spencerport was far from sharp in converting its inside goal attempts, but the pressure exerted on the Knights in the process yielded 34 free throws.

Twenty-three were cashed in, including 7 in the last five minutes, when the Rangers broke away from a 32-all deadlock.

McQuaid, which had trailed ever since Spencerport wiped out John Wolff's opening basket advantage, finally drew even, 32-32, on Dick Upday's foul shot at the 5-minute mark, but that was the last point the Knights scored for over 3 1/2 minutes.

In the interim, Spencerport's Bob Vandermaillie had sunk a pair of fouls to start the Rangers' string of 7, and McQuaid appeared well-beaten, 39-32, with less than 90 seconds remaining.

That's when the Knights staged a rally that all but pulled the game out of the fire. Upday's 2 foul shots and a basket by Dick Spies closed the gap to 39-36 with 30 seconds left, and an interception set Spies up for a layup that made it 39-38 with 15 seconds remaining.

Still another interception and an apparent McQuaid foul with 2 seconds left had the crowd in pandemonium, but a violation ruled out the Merrivell finish, and Spencerport went home with its second 1-point verdict over McQuaid in 3 years.

VANDERMAILLIE's 11 points took scoring honors in the typically ragged opener. For McQuaid, Upday and Sam Iannone were high, with 7 apiece. And, though his scoring statistics don't merit mention, Spencerport's Lyle Kitt was probably the biggest thorn in McQuaid's side all night.

Kitt was the engineer who moved the ball outside to set up the Rangers' moves against the McQuaid zone. It was mainly he who kept the Knights' defense from turning the tide toward the end.

In the J.V. opener, it was a different story altogether as Jim Van Allen's McQuaid squad, undefeated in 17 games as freshmen last season, picked right up with a 72-16 triumph over Spencerport.

McQUAID's freshmen will swing into action under coach M. Waters' 219, T. Bernard 211, W. Scheidt 201.
