

J. E. Lanigan Requiem Held

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated in the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Fulton, Monday, Nov. 25 for James E. Lanigan, widely known educator, business and civic leader.

Mr. Lanigan was a past grand knight of Fulton Council, Knights of Columbus; a past district deputy, 54th District, K. of C., and chairman of the New York State Council K. of C. Scholarship Fund. He was well known in Rochester fraternal and educational circles.

MR. LANIGAN appeared before industrial and educational groups all over New York State as a speaker on public relations and educational problems. He served as chairman of the Oswego State Teachers College Council from 1952 until 1961.

Last June members of the Newman Club at the College paid a special tribute to him by presenting him a plaque in gratitude for his years of service to the Catholic Center and the college. In K. of C. circles he was known for his Second Degree work.

He is survived by his wife, Edith Rinehart Lanigan, a son, William F. Lanigan of Chicago, brother, Harold Lanigan, Oswego, and two sisters, Miss Marie Lanigan and Miss Elizabeth Lanigan, both of Rochester.
