Parents Duty on Sex Instruction

Cincinnati — (NC) — Parents ought to be as anxious to protect their children from distorted sex information as from polio and smallpox, a Catholic physician declared here.

"Ninety per cent of children find out the facts of life outside the home," declared Dr. Jack C. Wilke. He urged parents to teach their children about sex "truly, accurately, reverently, directly, simply, and without embarrassment."

HE ALSO emphasized that the responsibility for sex education "belongs in the home, not in classrooms." Dr. Wilke and

his wife, Barbara, spoke (Sept. 6) at a parish meeting at Nativity church.

Mrs. Wilke said "many mothers dread" to teach their children about sex, but she added that "it's simply part of life and must be faced."

She also warned that "you can't simply tell the child to go in a corner and read the book you give him."

"If you feel you don't know enough to be able to instruct your child," she said, "then it is up to you to read the book, and to read it again if necessary until you feel you are able to give the instructions."

Dr. Wilke noted that parents sometimes avoid giving sex instructions because their children haven't asked any questions. "It behooves you to wonder why they haven't been asking them," he said.

Religion, Race Topic Set

Chicago — (RNS) — Speakers for the first National Conference on Religion and Race were announced here by Rabbi Marc Tannenbaum, program chairman for the meeting, which will be the first of its kind to be convened by agencies of all the major religious groups.

Sponsors of the conference to be held in this city Jan. 14-17, are the National Council of Churches' Department of Racial and Cultural Relations, the Synagogue Council of America's Social Action Commission, and the National Catholic Welfare Conference's Social Action Department.

The first two speakers to be selected are Dr. Abraham J. Heschel, a professor at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America in New York, who will give an address on "The Religious Basis of Equality of Opportunity" and Dr. Franklin H. Littell, a professor at Chicago Theological Seminary, who will give a critical historical review of the role of religious groups in race relations.

Lepers Want Nuns To Stay

Jaffna — (RNS) — Patients of the Hendale Leprosy Hospital here have appealed to Mrs. Sirimavo Bandaranaike, Prime Minister of Ceylon, to reconsider the ban on Roman Catholic nuns in government-operated hospitals.

The patients expressed apprehension, one report said, that if the nuns were sent away Ceylonese nurses might mistreat them because of their condition.

In June, Ceylon's Minister of Health, A. P. Jayasuriya, ruled that all nursing nuns must leave their posts in government hospitals by March 15, 1964. At one point some 300 Catholic nursing sisters were employed in government hospitals.
