

CAPTAIN LYNCH, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard J. Lynch, 256 Prospect St., Canandaigua, served at Fort Meade prior to being assigned to Greenland in March of 1961. He was killed in a helicopter accident in Greenland on August 24, 1961, after saying Mass for troops stationed at Camp Century.


