Holy Water Saves Sight
New York — (NC) — A quick-thinking fireman who used holy water to wash out acid hurled into a bus driver's eyes was credited by physicians with saving the driver's eyesight.
Deputy Chief Perry Peterson of the fire department's third division said he was summoned to a closed bus in which a man and woman were struggling. "Then this guy opened the door and came running out screaming in pain."
"He kept screaming, 'She threw acid on me. I'm blind,'" Peterson said. "I looked for water and saw the church (St. Francis of Assisi) and kind of dragged and led him there. The first thing I saw was the holy water font, so I washed his face and eyes in it."
Peterson then took the bus driver, Bernard Prize, to a fire station house, where the burns were washed more thoroughly. Doctors said later that Prize was badly burned about the face and hands, but credited Peterson with saving his eyesight. The woman who threw the acid, Natalie Weprin, was arrested and charged with felonious assault.

Stamps Mark Council Close
Rome — (NC) — Italy has issued two special stamps to mark the end of the first session of the Second Vatican Council.
The subject of both is an illustration from a sixth-century Syrian Gospel depicting the Holy Ghost descending on the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin. The stamps differ only in color and denomination: the red stamp has a value of 30 lire and the blue of 70 lire.

Council Not a Choir

Vatican City — (RNS) — Dismissing the divergent views of the prelates attending the Second Vatican Council, Pope John XXIII said the first session would have been "monotonous (81) illnesses can be expected, if the Fathers had been of the same opinion."
The pontiff told a large gathering of pilgrims: "We know that the Fathers at times expressed divergent views, especially during the early meetings. But this is understandable, for we are not, after all, friars singing in a choir."
Pope John's remarks came during his first general audience since his recent illness. In addressing the pilgrims in Clementine Hall of the Vatican Palace, he noted that at his age illnesses can be expected.

Birth Control Topic at UN

Catholic Nations, Kremlin Agree

United Nations — (RNS) — Catholic Ireland and Italy found themselves allied with the Soviet Union and other Communist bloc countries in a debate here over a proposal to set up population control programs under United Nations auspices in countries wishing them.
Both Ireland and Italy, along with other countries with large Roman Catholic populations, argued against the proposal on moral and religious grounds. The proposed program would provide U.N. technical assistance on family planning and birth control to countries requesting such aid.
They were joined in opposition to the proposal by the Soviet Union — but the Russians made their decision on Marxist ideological grounds.
Russian delegate George P. Arkadiev said his delegation would abstain since "the problem of the underdeveloped lands is not one of more population growth, but development of resources and expansion of industry."
The Romanian delegation said the answer to overpopulation was not "liquidating future populations" but "liquidating the effects of the colonial past" of the underdeveloped countries.
Earlier, Dr. Louis Cullen of Ireland said the proposal was "morally repugnant" to the Irish people as well as many other U.N. member countries.
Italian delegate Vittorio Zardotti observed that his country had suffered for many years from overpopulation and found a "safety valve" in emigration. On moral grounds, he said, Italy could not agree to the use of any funds contributed to birth control programs.

Principals Tops In Vote Contest

Cleveland — (NC) — Principals of Catholic high schools here placed one-two-three in a "principal of the year" contest sponsored by radio station WHK.
Brother Charles Krupp, C.S.C., principal of St. Edward High School, was first with 43,000 votes out of 236,000 cast by teenagers. He was followed by Sister Mary Terence of Lourdes Academy, 41,000 votes, and Sister Mary Patricia, 38,000 votes. Principals of four other Catholic high schools also placed in the top 10.

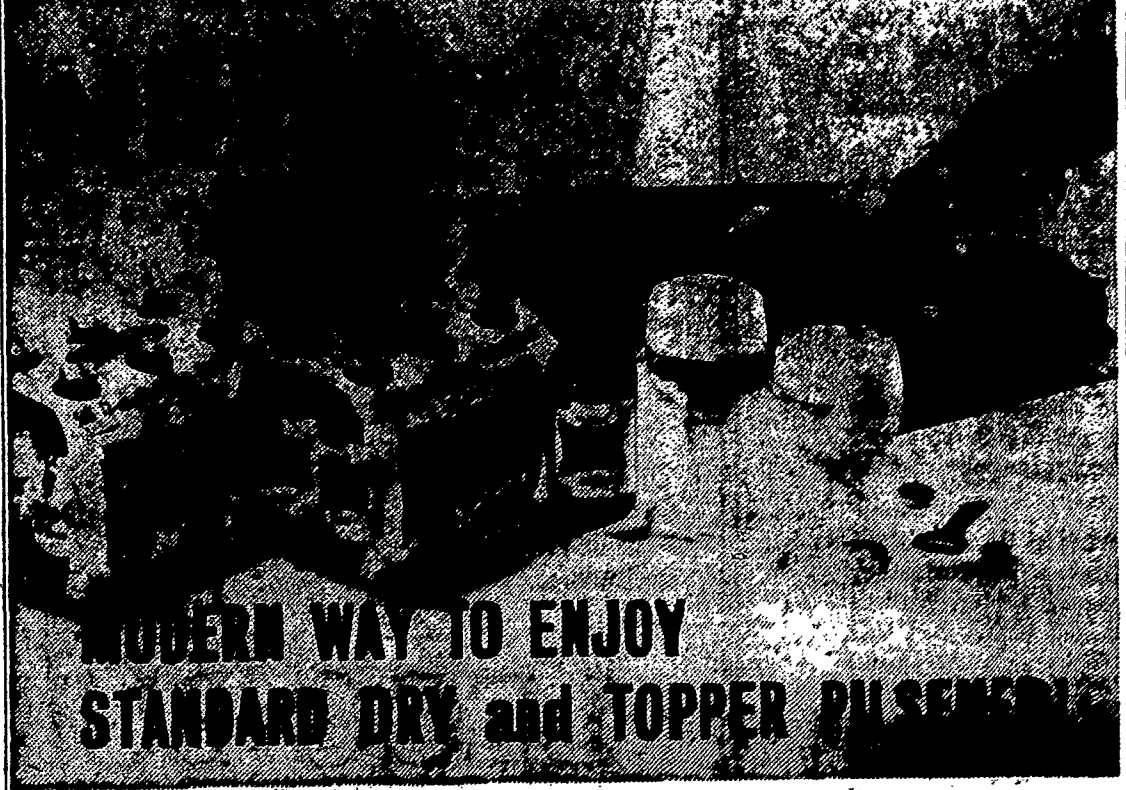
Reds Step Up Youth Rites

Berlin — (RNS) — An intensified drive to enroll young people in Communist rites — is under way in the Soviet Zone.
This was revealed in an East German broadcast which said the Central Committee for Youth Dedication had met to discuss its propaganda programs.
It said a resolution adopted by the conference stated for the first time that "religious ties are no obstacle to youth taking part in the dedication ceremonies."
