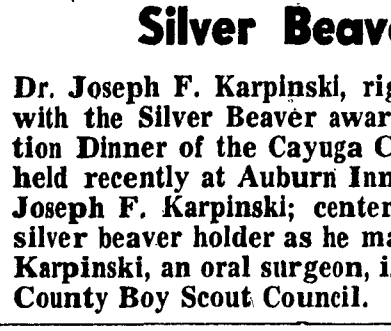

Prelate Predicts More 'Dialogue'

St. Louis — (NC) — Joseph Cardinal Ritter had high praise for a four-hour dialogue here in which 75 priests and 75 Protestant ministers took part. "These meetings have had my blessing from the very beginning, and I shall do all in my power to further them," the Archbishop of St. Louis told the participants at the conclusion of the meeting, held in Kenrick Seminary.

THE PRIESTS and ministers discussed the book "The Council, Reform and Reunion," by Father Hans Kueng, professor of Catholic theology at the University of Tubingen in West Germany.

Three seminary heads took part in the dialogue: Dr. Robert T. Fauth, president of Eden Seminary of the United Church of Christ; Dr. Alfred O. Fuerbringer, president of Concordia Seminary of the Missouri Synod Lutheran Church; and Father Nicholas E. Persich, C.M., rector of Kenrick Seminary.

In commenting on Father Kueng's book, Dr. Elmer J. F. Arndt of Eden Seminary said that "Dr. Kueng has done us non-Romans a great service by his insistence on reform." He also said that much of the language calling for reform could apply to Protestants as well as to Catholics.

Father Robert F. Coerver, vice rector of Kenrick Seminary, said: "The work of positive renewal must come first before any reunion is possible. It is going on now in the Second Vatican Council. I think, too, it is also going on in the Protestant Church. I think both are

Trees 'Violate' Constitution

Sharon, Mass. — (RNS) — There will be no Christmas trees or similar decorations in classrooms of three public schools, including the high school here. The principals believe decorations would violate separation of Church and State principles.

As a result, several hundred parents have registered protests to no avail. Chairman Richard Hosmer explained the committee is leaving it up to individual principals whether to permit trees in the classrooms during the Christmas season.

Reds OK Visit To West Berlin

Berlin — (RNS) — Archbishop Alfred Bengsch Bishop of Berlin who resides in the city's Eastern Sector, has been granted a travel permit by the East German government to visit West Berlin on Dec. 22 and 25, Christmas Day.

The archbishop will celebrate a Christmas Mass in the Church of St. Sebastian in West Berlin where he also will preside at a wedding.

Youngest At Rome College

Rome — (NC) — Father John F. McCarthy of Butte, Mont., has been named an assistant professor of the Pontifical Institute of Canon and Civil Law at the Pontifical Lateran University here.

The 32-year-old priest is the youngest member of the family of the Lateran, one of Rome's most important ecclesiastical universities, and the only member whose native tongue is English.

The appointment of Father McCarthy as a full time member of the school of law at the Lateran is a recognition of the growing American tradition of scholarship at the university in the field of canon law. A notable example in this regard has been set by Msgr. Clairborne Lafferty of Little Rock, Ark., who until recently lectured at the law institute.

Nora Farrell Requiem, Mother Of Two Priests

Funeral Mass for Nora Burke Farrell, mother of two priests, was offered in Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Wednesday, Dec. 19. Mrs. Farrell, 70 of 189 Palmerston Rd., Brighton died Dec. 16, 1962, 12 days after the death of her husband, James H. Farrell.

In New York State, chapters are located in Auburn, Buffalo, Syracuse, Mohawk Valley, Long Island, and the Southern Tier (Corning, Elmira, Watkins Glen and a number of small communities).

Auburn is the oldest chapter while Syracuse and Buffalo vie for the honor of being the largest.

One example of the rapid growth of the chapters is provided in the Long Island area. Eleven new members joined the Long Island chapter during the past year alone, bringing total membership to over 40.

Cross Given To Aid India

Bombay — (RNS) — Roman Catholic support of India during the invasion of Red Chinese forces, impressive collectively and individually, was best symbolized by one of the personal gifts of Valerian Cardinal Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay.

He sent to Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru a cherished and expensive gold pectoral cross he had worn almost nine years. It had been the gift of a close friend, a Muslim, shortly after Cardinal Gracias was named a Prince of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1953.

The prelate said he would use "the simple one I have on for the rest of my life."
