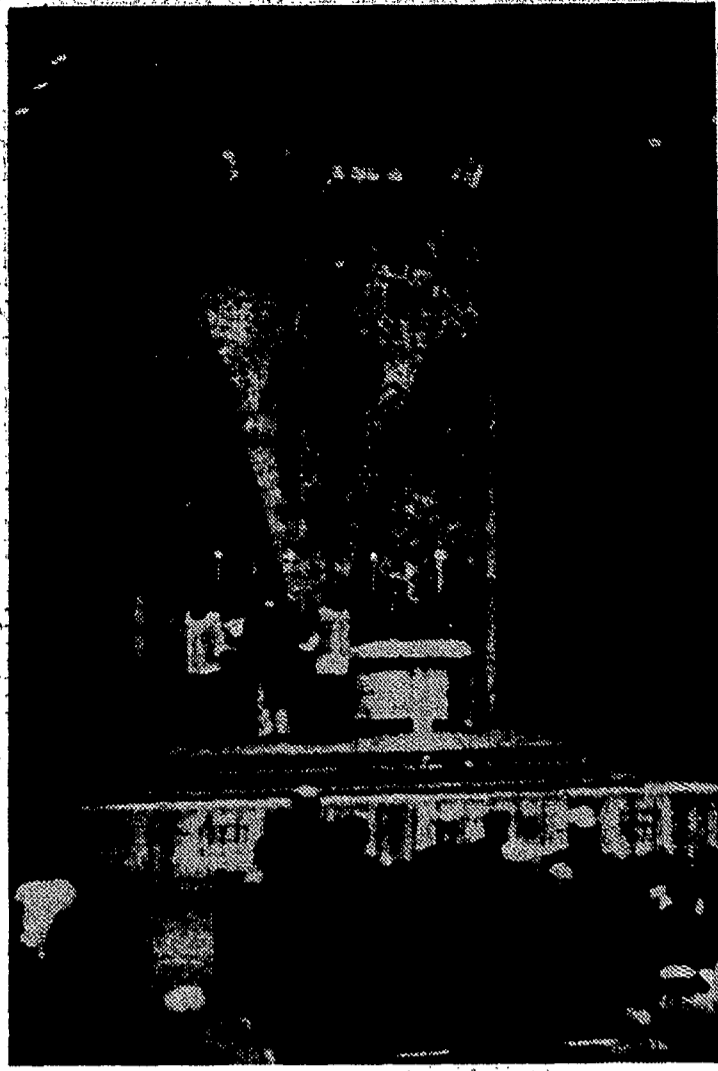
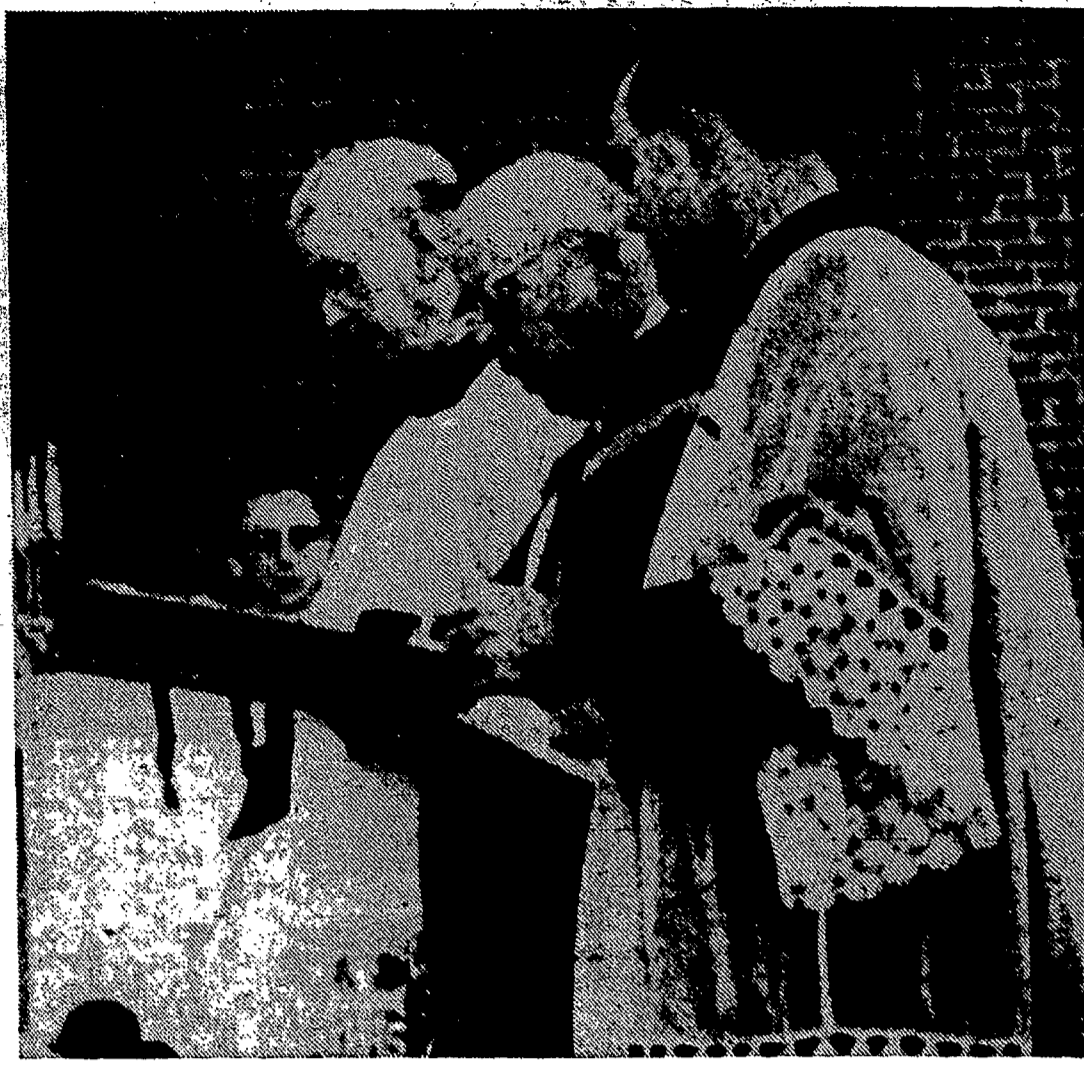


New Altar at St. Ann's Home

Nazareth College has received a donation of \$10,000 to help finance construction of a new Sisters' chapel.

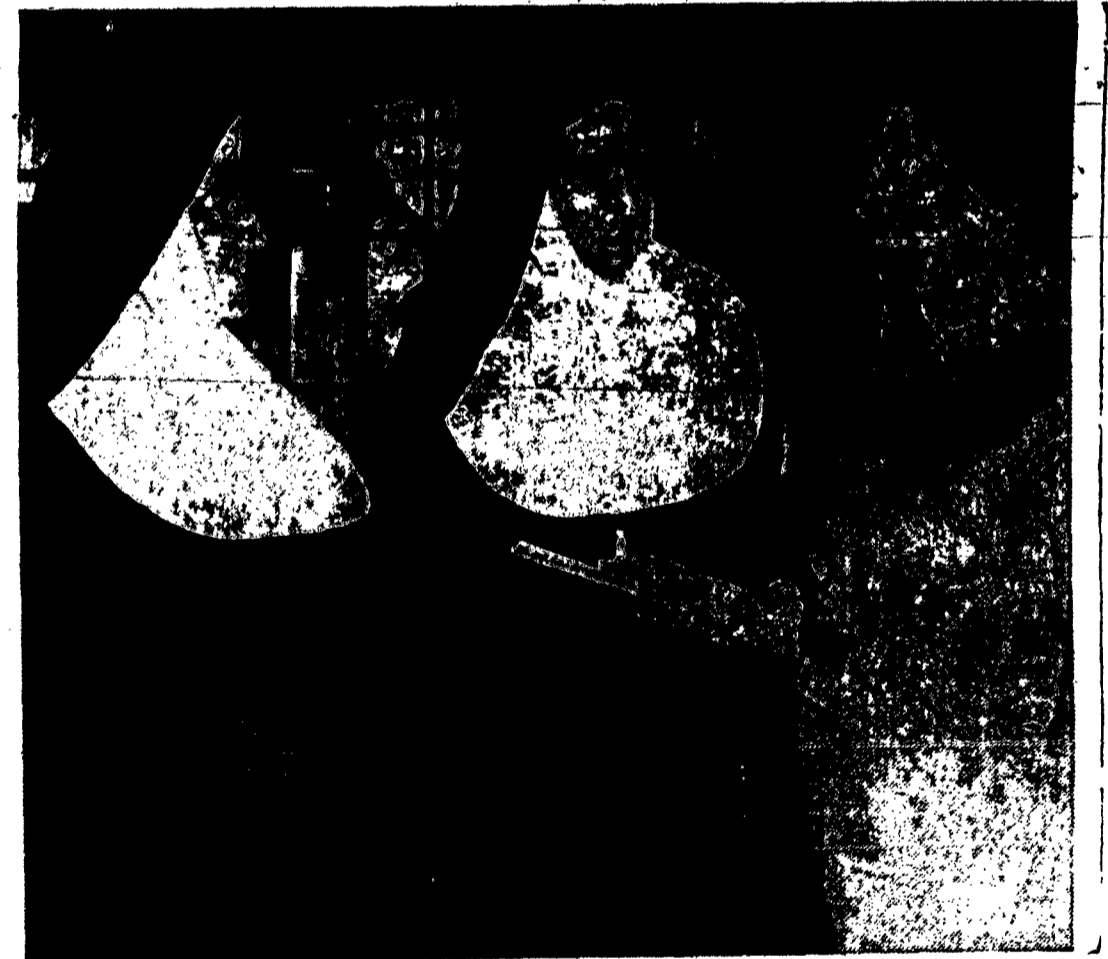
