Sacred Heart Topic For Friday Luncheon

"Enthronement of the Sacred Heart" will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Naughton's topic at the First Friday Luncheon Club meeting, Jan. 4 at 12:10 (noon) in Hotel Sheraton according to Family Court Judge Emmett J. Schnepf, chairman.

Monsignor Naughton, pastor of St. Anne's Church will be presented by the Rev. William B. Holberton, club moderator and chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus sponsoring organization.

The speaker will recall his trip to Europe where he visited the Shrine of St. Margaret Mary of Alacoque where the nun received the promises for those who observe the First Friday devotions.

MONSIGNOR Naughton after his ordination June 11, 1937, served as assistant pastor of Holy Rosary Church until 1932 when he became a professor and procurator at St. Bernard's Seminary.

In August, 1945, he was named pastor of St. Peter and Paul's, Elmira, where under his direction the school, rectory and convent had to be repaired following a flood that did untold damage. During his last year there a new convent for the Sisters of St. Joseph teaching in the parish school was constructed.

Bishop Kearney announced in February, 1957, the elevation of the Rev. William J. Naughton with others to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor.
