Choice Honors (RNS) — Pope John XXIII has presided over a memorial service in the Roman Catholic "repentance church" at Bergen, a small community near the notorious Nazi concentration camp of Bergen-Belsen in the Luneburg Heath.

A letter from Ambello Cardinal Cicognani, Vatican Secretary of State, accompanying the gift, noted it was "the wish of the Holy Father that this church, dedicated to the Precious Blood of Our Lord, may contribute to keep alive the spirit of repentance among men of our days."

The church was built as a memorial shrine to the victims of the Hitler regime and especially to the 30,000 persons, mostly Jews, who were killed in the camp. One of the masses graves at the camp contains the remains of Anne Frank, the heroic Jewish girl whose diary written during the Nazi occupation of Holland in World War II achieved world-wide fame.

Mother Seton Relatives Graves Noted

New York — (NC) — A tablet given by Catholic nuns to mark the graves of six relatives of Venerable Mother Elizabeth Seton has been placed on the wall of a Protestant church.

The bronze tablet was affixed to an exterior wall of St. Andrew's Episcopal church, Richmond, Staten Island, in a ceremony Jan. 4 attended by Protestant and Catholic representatives.

The ceremony took place on the 142nd anniversary of the death of Mother Seton, convert and U.S. foundress of the Sisters of Charity, whose beatification may take place some time this year.

Participating in the ceremony were the Rev. Bernard Hornasty, rector of St. Andrew's church, Mother Loreto Bernard, mother general of the New York Sisters of Charity who donated the tablet, Mother Mary, a former mother general, and members of the New York Community Council.

Reds Claim 'Politics' At Council

Berlin — (RNS) — An East German Communist official attacked world politics played an important part in the first session of the Second Vatican Council but said the spirit of the Council "has so far been one of conciliation and peace, both religiously and politically."

The Communist speaker hailed Pope John XXIII for having "stated expressly that the time has come for the safeguarding of peace and for achieving agreements through negotiations."

IN CLAIMING that politics had played a role at the Council, the East German speaker referred specifically to the question of Vatican recognition of the Polish western territories annexed from Germany after World War II.

It said West Germany's Ambassador to the Vatican, Dr. Hilger von Scherpenberg, had demanded that a reference by Pope John to the territories be clarified and that the Holy See make it clear that West Germany retains its right to the areas.

(Pope John was reported to have indicated to Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski and other Polish bishops at an audience that he favored Poland's rights to the Western territories. He was quoted as alluding to "your western territories now recovered after centuries of separation.")

Dr. von Scherpenberg made sharply-worded protests to the East German Radio declared "It was supported by Cardinal Frings of Cologne and Cardinal Doepfner of Munich. But all this resulted only in much struggling of the West." Roman Curia and the cardinals were told, "We can neither deny nor comment on what was said by the Pope."

Garfield Heights, Ohio — (RNS) — Parishioners of St. Therese's Catholic Church have contributed 13 statues of their favorite saints to be displayed in the church on appropriate feastdays. The statues will be placed on a portable pedestal in the sanctuary on feastdays and kept in the sacristy during the rest of the year.

43 Letters In Alphabet

Cleveland — (ANS) — Auxiliary Bishop Clarence E. Elwell, superintendent of the schools in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Cleveland, was one of three educators who flew to London, England, to study a new alphabet.

Bishop Elwell said he has been impressed with the new Initial Teaching Alphabet (ITA) as the 43-character alphabet is called. He said it may be useful to first and second grade students.

'Open Housing' Program

Detroit — (RNS) — Protestant, Catholic and Jewish leaders from Detroit met here for the first city-wide interreligious conference on problems of racial discrimination in housing.

More than 500 persons attended the two-day conference housing or any other necessity of life to a fellow human being.

Father Hubert A. Matko, pastor of St. Lucy's Catholic church, St. Clair's Shores, pointed out that "when we refuse to house or any other necessity of life to a fellow human being, we deny it to the Lord Himself, Christ identified Himself with the homeless and the distressed."

He urged religious groups to take a large role in solving housing problems. The Catholic Community Council and the Jewish Community Council were the three groups, along with Protestant representatives, who presented the Detroit housing program.
