



### New St. Ambrose School

CONSTRUCTION HAS STARTED on the new St. Ambrose School, with completion scheduled for the Fall of 1963. The design provides for a two-story wing of 14 classrooms; principal's office, health suite, and teachers' lounges. A one-story wing houses a multi-purpose room, shower and locker rooms, kitchen and cafeteria facilities, physical director's office and storage areas. Building is wall bearing construction of face brick and concrete block bonded, bar joist floor construction. Multi-purpose room is steel frame. Interior finishes are plaster and concrete block painted. Finished floors in the classroom wing shall be carpeted throughout. Finished walls of the administra-

tion area in the wood panel. Heating and ventilating of classrooms by unit ventilators, gas fired circulating hot water. Fluorescent lighting to be installed in classroom wing and incandescent lighting in the multi-purpose room. Bids received for construction including general, electrical, and heating and ventilating total \$498,000 dollars. The cost per square foot is \$12.45. Contractors are S. P. Vasile & Son, general construction, Cashette Electric, Inc., electrical work. Hoxm and Bassett, Inc., plumbing and heating work. Ribson and Roberts are architects for the project.

### Laymen's Mass League Membership Drive Set

The Daily Mass League, which now has 9,800 members in the Rochester Diocese and 23,000 in 47 states and 10 foreign countries, has begun its second annual Membership Crusade, which will continue through the month of January.

Special representatives are being designated in each parish to help promote the activity through distribution of informational leaflets and application blanks.

The Crusade has the approval and blessing of Bishop Kearney expressed in the following letter to Harold J. Coleman, one of the founders of the League: "During the next few weeks we shall hear the wish, so often expressed, that 1963 may be blessed with God's justice and peace. For the attaining of this gift from God there is no more powerful intercession than the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The attendance at daily Mass sanctifies each day, brings rich blessings to the ones who practice it, and is our most powerful weapon in the struggle for the Kingdom of God upon earth. I can think of no more salutary resolution for 1963 than the resolution to attend Mass each day. What a blessing for the soul of any man!"
