The greatest religious event in this century is the Second Vatican Council, Bishop Casey said in a talk Sunday evening...

Bishop Casey described the opening rites, the stirring spectacle attended by nearly 8,000 of the world's Catholic bishops...

Highlights of Bishop Casey's talk follow: Some after his election as Supreme Pontiff of the Catholic Church, Pope John was talking with his Secretary of State, Cardinal Domenico Tardini...

Some Vatican officials said it would be impossible to make the needed preparations by 1963. Pope John decided quite simply the Council would begin in 1962.

Questionnaires were sent to Catholic bishops around the world and their comments and suggestions were edited by preparatory commissions...

Prelates voiced different viewpoints but obviously were devoted to the same goal.

Teamwork Means Better Care At St. Ann's, Director States

Teamwork means less work for patients, "Our guests come here to know the aides better and to be cared for better and the case."

In St. Ann's Home's three-day orientation the new employees learn the physical layout of the home and special care of geriatric guests and under the supervision of a nurse aide will begin to observe operation of the physiotherapy department...

Assigning teams of nurses, aides to groups of patients makes for "more personal, more complete care and smoother all-around operation," Mary E. Cunningham, of St. Ann's Home, said.

THIS SYSTEM is only three weeks old, but already has paid off several times, she said. "I know what to look for, the non-professional employee can spot symptoms as quickly as anyone and contact a nurse."

SISTER MARY GENEVIEVE died Jan. 10, 1963, in the Sisters of Mercy Motherhouse infirmary, having just completed 68 years of religious life as a Sister of Mercy. She had a teaching career of 61 years. Born in Limerick, Ireland, Sister taught in the National Convent School there for three years, previous to her entering the Rochester Sisters of Mercy Community in 1895.

During her 58 years of service in schools of the Rochester diocese, she taught every grade of elementary school from first through eighth. She taught for 12 years at Holy Family School, Auburn; 12 years at St. Charles Borromeo School, Greece; and 4 years at Old Saint Mary's School, Rochester.
