New Schools Meet on Court

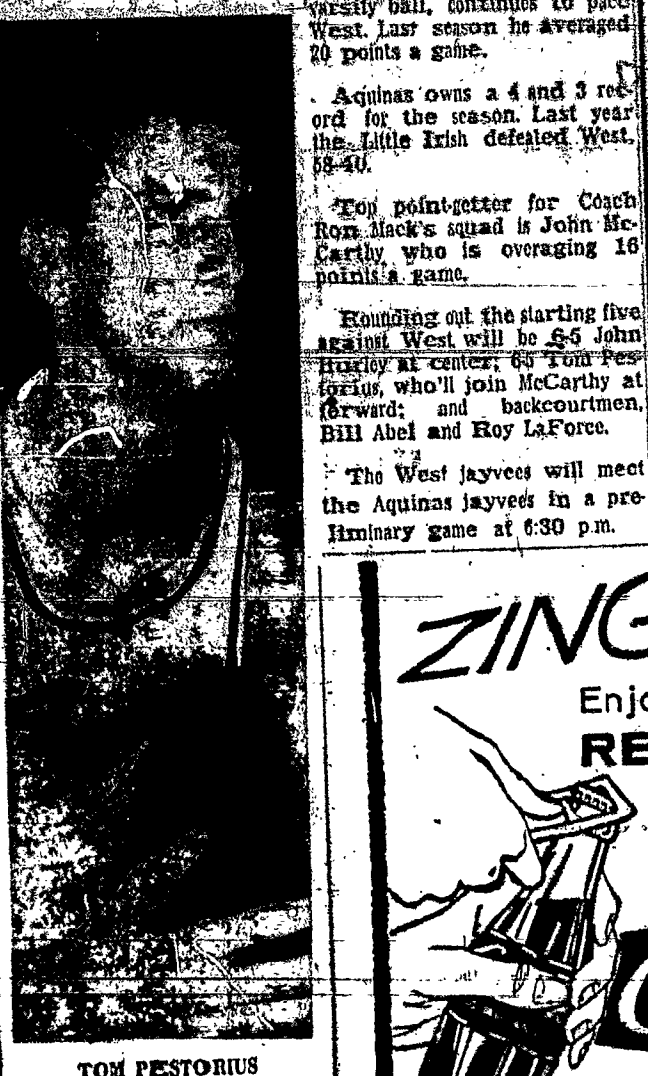

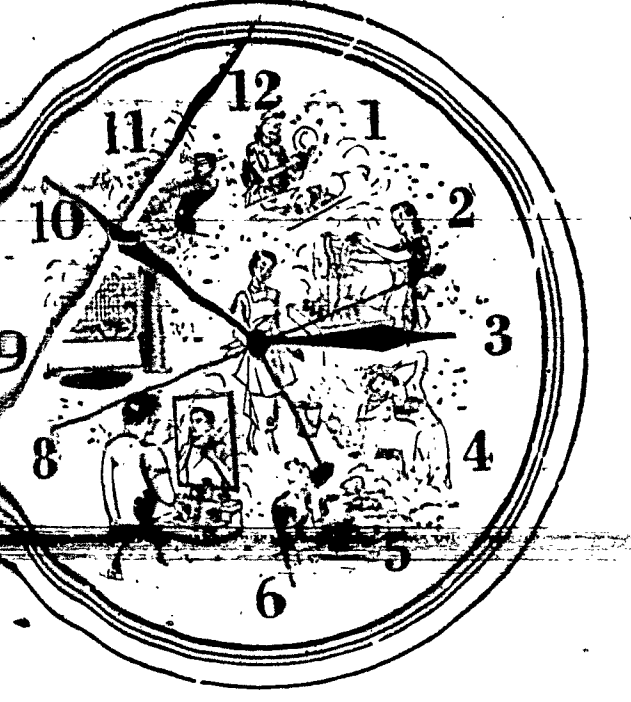
