The Merry Widow has received renewed attention from two record companies in recent weeks. Lehár's irresistible melodies have always sparkled and the new discs will please anyone with a fancy for Viennese music in a lighter vein.

Angel Records has surpassed its original release of the record ten years ago. Elizabeth Schwarzkopf again takes the role of the witty, wealthy and ever-popular widow. Lush orchestration and the use of Balkan instruments in the party scene add a remarkable touch to Miss Schwarzkopf's superb singing. Nicholas Godin and Eberhard Weicher display a fervent support in an excellent lead.

On the Columbia label Lisa Della Casa takes the title role with warmth and brilliance. Able support is given by John Heardon and Charles K. Davis. Excellent orchestration enhances the fine singing in all parts. A tough choice to make between the two labels.

Step the World I Want to Go (1st) with the original Broadway cast has been recorded on the London label. A top-notch musical with a fine cast. The brilliant performance of Anthony Newley and Leslie Briggles. What Kind of Fool Am I? Gonna Build a Mountain and Once in a Lifetime are but three of an album full of top-notch music.

Love Makes the World Go Round — Anne Marie Albright sings it's Most Unusual Day. I Want to Be Happy and other songs with Luther Henderson conducting. Good but not up to par with her past performances. A stronger bass could have added to the excitement. (MGM)

On My Way (Ain't Showin' Akin) — Count Basie plays Neil Hill. Modern jazz in the hands of the master. (Verve)

More Cole Special — Nat "King" Cole makes the best of a poor selection of songs. (Capitol)

Biel, K.H.S., supreme president of the Knights and Mrs. Teresa Gaster, supreme president of the Auxiliaries. Both were from Rochester.

An imposing new marble altar erected to mark the Centenary of Immaculate Conception Parish, Ithaca, was to be used for the first time for Easter Masses according to Rev. William Byrne, pastor.

Bishop Kearney gave the concluding sermon in the Lenten series at St. Francis De Sales Church, Geneva. This marked the first official visit of Bishop Kearney to Geneva.
