Disc Notes



From Paul Conestable

Every so often a provocative new recording comes out that sets the goal for others to strive for. Such a recording is Gustav Mahler's Symphony No. 1 in D Major under the unique artistry of the late Bruno Walter and the Columbia Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Walter's music in every phase of this unprecedented Columbia stereo rendition from the glory of the first movement through the triumph of the finale, in the slow movement, he has captured from meticulous excellence that has not since been sacrificed for effect in previous recordings.

It is doubtful that Mr. Walter will ever be surpassed in this masterpiece, a feat that he also accomplished when he directed Beethoven's Symphony No. 8 on the Columbia label. Both are the last work in excellence.

For those who want to show off their stereo sets and don't want to report to people of inland, sea or island, here comes their living room, for they have come up with a selection in their Victory in Rome, new album, they have captured the sound of marching bands in an excellent stereo effect. One can almost picture the bands as they march from left to right playing stirring pyrotechnic and marching music. One hundred and 20 voices and instruments join in the five minute long finale at White Johny Green Marching Home complete with authentic reverbating cannon barrages. A stereo showcase that is music rather than screaming noise.

Wilson Farrell has released her fourth and by far her best "pop" album. Together With Love, with Andre Previn and his orchestra. The charming soprano excels on a new number, "Where I Wonder," by Previn and his wife, Dory Landon. Other numbers include "Sleeping Beauty" by Myself and Spring is Here (Columbia).

Brain's Flame Concerto No. 1 has received new brilliance in a recent release on the Columbia label. Curzon and Scall have combined for a great new version of the concerto that couldn't be better.

Max's Bratsberg Concertos conducted by Rudolph Busch partner on the Deutsche Grammophon label. Busch, a devotee for the music lover, is getting strong competition from Angelo's new release with Kemper conducting.

Parsons Island, containing the Hawaiian War Chant, Love by White Winds, My Little Grass Shack etc. gets top notch treatment from the Ray Charles Singers in a new release. (Columbia)
