## Father Kelly, Ithaca Takes JCD Degree

With the publication of his doctoral dissertation in June last month, Rev. Thomas E. Kelly, O. P. S., of the Holy Trinity of 225 West Seneca St. Ithaca, has completed the final requirement for obtaining his doctorate in ecclesiastical law.

The degree was conferred with the distinction of "cum laude" by the University of Vienna in Austria.

Father Kelly's doctorate represents three years' graduate study at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas in Rome during that period he also studied ecclesiastical law at the University of Cambridge in England, and international law at the University of Vienna in Austria.

Father Kelly is presently assigned to the state of the Dominican Province of St. Thomas, New York City, where he is an administrative assistant for legal affairs.

Since his return from Europe last summer he has conducted a series of lectures in Catholicism in the New York area and has been associated with the National Catholic Welfare Conference's Office for United Nations Affairs as an adviser in international law.

Father Kelly has also been appointed a consultant for the National Legion of Decency.
