

Field Mass To Open Boy Scouts Retreat

Seneca Falls — By 7:30 p.m., Friday, May 3, 300 Boy Scouts and their leaders, Explorers and Explorer Advisors, will cross all county lines within the Finger Lakes Council to attend Mass at Camp Babcock-Hovey in Otsego to begin their first annual Catholic Boy Scouts retreat.

The Rev. Edward Golden, assistant pastor of St. Stephen's Church, Geneva, will be retreat master. He is the Council's Deaconry Chaplain. Edward A. Healey, Sr., will be retreat leader. He is pastor of St. Ignace's Church, Seneca Falls. Paul F. Hanel is retreatmaster for troop 18; Explorer Advisor, Ray Saunders for Explorer Post 20.

Finger Lakes Council Area lay committee chairman, Carl Kozel, has appointed Commissioner Robert Howe as campmaster to direct the retreatants by troop and district from which they come.

THE SERVICE CORPS comprised of the Knights of Dunamis, a fraternal group of youth who have reached the rank of Eagle Scouts, Order of the Arrow and who specialize in camping and scouts belonging to Alpha Phi Omega, college students whose interest in scouting has continued.

In cases where it is necessary to recruit boys for service in the area, the retreat is held under the supervision of the lay committee, Louis Lando.

Meals will be prepared by scouts with the aid of their leaders. Camp preparation and serving meals on time are responsibilities. The food received is top grade, turned into top grade meals.

Camp health and safety directors request visitors observing the retreat to observe traffic regulations closely, in view of the increase in vehicles on the main road beyond the

hanger Brown Station and leading to the camping area and retreat site.

THE RETREAT will open officially with a field Mass at 7 a.m. Saturday morning. Communion will be at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. A Rosary recitation following the campfire ceremonies at 8 p.m. Sunday Mass at 7 a.m. Conference at 10 a.m. and retreat exercises through Sunday at noon complete the program.

The most important aspect of the retreat, it is pointed out, is the religious attitude of the Boy Scouts. They bless each meal and attend church services. They seek to carry out the Scout promise of "A Scout is reverent."

Bishop's Honors 10 Retired Employees

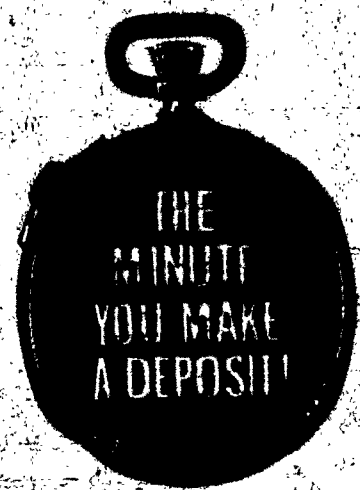
