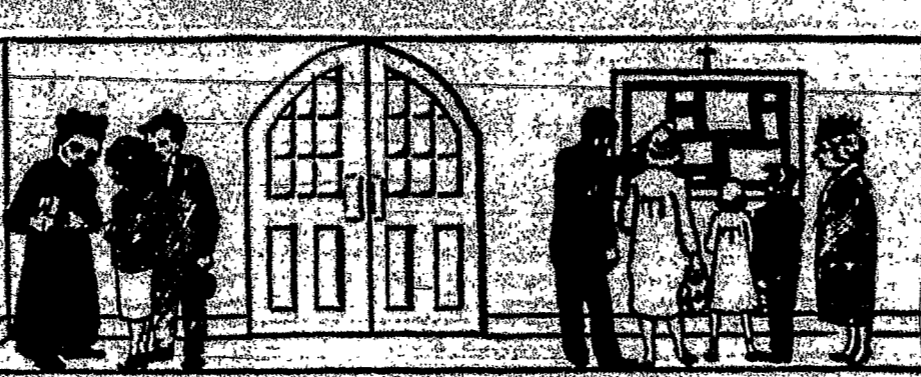
OUR LADY OF VICTORY
