When you read this column, I will be in Rome making an annual report to the Holy Father and his Congregation of the Propagation of the Faith on how well we have fulfilled our stewardship during the past year.

As the representative of the Holy Father's Pontilical Mission Societies in the United States, we are responsible for the following duties:

1. To inspire the bishops, priests and faithful of the United States to aid the Holy Father in caring for \$0,000 schools; 10,000 hospitals and dispensaries; 2,000 orphanages; 400 leprosaria; 500 homes for the aged; and 300,000 missionaries in various parts of the world.

2. To inspire the faithful of the United States to fulfill the words of the Holy Father that he is to be "first and principally sided." The Pontill does not say that he is to be uniquely sided but that, as Vicar of Christ, he is to be the first one thought of in missionary sid; secondly, the principal part of the aid is to be given to him.
