## 2 From Diocese To Be Ordained

The Rev. Gregory St. Weider will be ordained to the priesthood on Saturday, May 25, in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Albany. Ordaining prelate will be Bishop William A. Scully of Albany.

FATHER WEIDER is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard L. Weider of 410 Westminster Road, Rochester, both prominent in lay activities in the Diocese.

He attended St. Boniface School and is a graduate of St. Monica's School and St. Andrew's Seminary, Rochester. He attended St. Bernard's Seminary and was assigned by Bishop Scully to conclude his theological studies at the Seminary of Our Lady of Angels, formerly at Niagara University, now in Albany, New York.

During the summer months he was counselor in the Day Camp programs at St. Monica's School, Geneva Settlement House, and Charles Settlement House, Rochester.

Father Weider will offer his First Solemn Mass in the Church of the Blessed Sacrament, Rochester, on Sunday, May 26, at 12:15 p.m. Assisting him will be Rev. John J. Cavanaugh of St. Andrew's Seminary, Archpriest, Rev. Michael J. O'Leary of Albany, Deacon, Mr. Timothy G. Weider, a brother attending St. Bernard's Seminary, subdeacon.

The sermon will be delivered by Rev. John E. Murray, C.M., professor of Sacred Scripture at the Seminary of Our Lady of Angels.

In the sanctuary will be Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas P. Connors, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church. Sponsor for Ordination will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert, Pastor of St. Monica's Church. Assisting at the First Mass will include Joseph Weider, a brother, and John Weider, a cousin, students at St. Andrew's Seminary and Richard Weider Jr., a brother who is a candidate for St. Andrew's, and seminarians of the parish.

The Blessed Sacrament Boys Chorus, under the direction of Sister Mary Claudia, S.S.J., will chant the Mass.

Friends of Father Weider are invited to receive his blessing at his home, 410 Westminster Road, Sunday, May 26, from 4 until 7 p.m.

Father Weider will serve in the Diocese of Albany.

## Fund Drive At St. James

With the formation of the executive committee, which met Monday, May 13, in the parish hall, the St. James Parish Increased Offering Program is officially underway. It was announced by the Rev. Francis M. Eganey, pastor and honorary general chairman of the program.

The purpose of the program is to provide adequate funds to alleviate the parish's indebtedness, provide for the increased cost of parish maintenance and set aside funds for future developments as needed.

The method used is a variation from the usual capital funds program, in that the program asks for increased parish support through the regular channels, the Sunday collection envelope. In this program, each parish is asked to contribute "one hour's wages more per week" for church support.

This executive committee for the parish program is busy enlisting additional parishioners to serve as committee members to assist with the advance and general phase solicitations, Sunday, June 16 and 23, respectively.

General chairman for the campaign is Edmund H. Principe, while advance co-chairmen are Walter F. Morton and William Strom. Advisory vice chairmen are William Mulcahy and Joseph A. Renaud; general vice chairmen are Edward Finn, Bernard Fischette and Leon T. Ward.

A secondary purpose of the campaign is to urge every parishioner to make regular use of the collection envelopes. To facilitate this, the monthly school and debt retirement collection will be combined with the ordinary Sunday offering. On the Sundays of solicitation, each parishioner will be asked to estimate his intended church support for the next 12-month period.

Professional counsel for the program is provided by Joseph J. Connorton, a representative of Foley Associates, Inc. of Rochester.

## St. Mary's Marks Hospital Week

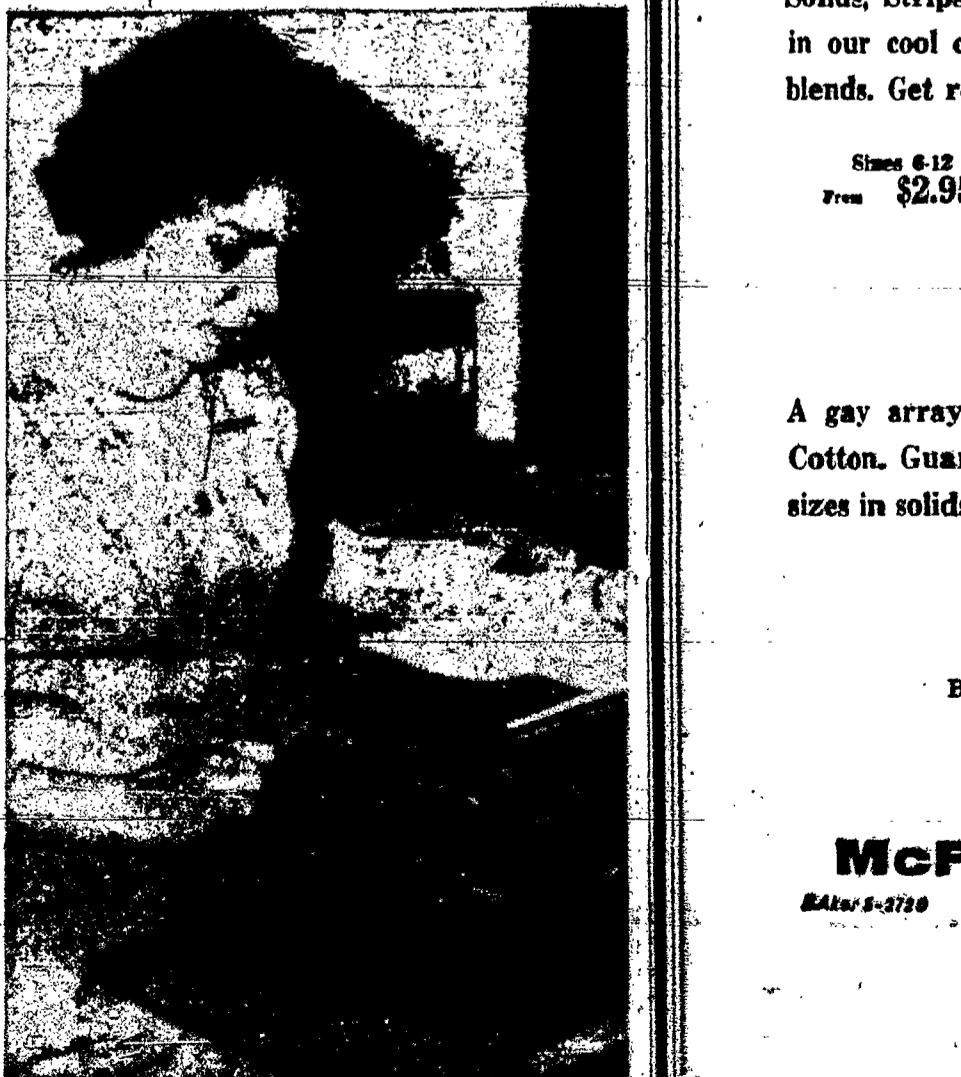
This week St. Mary's Hospital has been joining the other hospitals in the city in celebrating Rochester Hospital Week. Following the theme of the Week — "To

## Lay Missioners In Mexico

St. Martin de Porres Dispensary in Monterrey, Mexico, administered by Dan and Margaret Whalen, has become so well-known among the sick-poor of the area that it is necessary to turn away an overflow of 25 to 40 patients each day.

This is the latest report from the East Avon couple, who began their work among the Mexican people in 1950. Sick-ness is not the only plague of the Mexicans. A weeks-long heat wave with the temperature at 110 degrees has left

them without water and, therefore, no harvest.

MANY ARE abandoning their possessions in southern Mexico and moving to the north for help—but there is none. As a result, the Whalens are faced with the sick and homeless. Many are lost because of lack of funds for plasma and medicines.

As of the end of January, the Whalens had administered medical care and medicine to 5,123 people. Flour and powdered milk were distributed to at least half this number.

A surprise visit to the dispensary by Harold Duffus and his sister, Miss Marie Duffus, of Rochester on a tour of Mexico

helped to brighten the rather dark picture of the situation. The couple reports that clothes donated in Rochester are held up in Laredo, Texas because the Mexican government refuses the entry of any clothing for the poor.

However, they can receive money from persons at home willing to help the poor in the area. They say, "The situation is so desperate, they report, that any help had to be turned out empty handed nor any who are ill were not helped."
