Theatre League Season Listed

When the stage lights go up at the Auditorium Theatre at six p.m. on Thursday, May 16, there will be a unique stage setting. The chairman, board members and workers for the Rochester Broadway Theatre League subscription campaign will be sitting and gleaming information on next year's season.

Over two hundred devoted Rochester Broadway Theatre League followers, with Mrs. Hawley Ward as Chairman—assisted by a campaign advisory committee—will "kick off" their campaign for new subscribers.

The League is the only non-profit organization which has brought at least four hit Broadway offers to Rochester's Auditorium Theatre for the last six years. Because Rochester Broadway Theatre League is a non-profit group, the savings are passed on to theatre-goers.

This year's hits begin with "A Man For All Seasons"—Oct. 3, A. S.—originally London performance and now the recipient of five Tony awards and the Critics Circle Prize. Others are The Royal Shakespeare Company's "The Hollow Crown"—Jan. 9, 10, 11; "Take Her She's Mine"—Jan. 30, 31, Feb. 1; and "A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum," the entire week of March 2.

Ad Altare Dei Awards Slated At Two Parishes

Presentation of the Ad Altare Dei Award will take place on Friday evening June 7 at 8 p.m. at two locations according to a bulletin released by the Catholic Committee on Scouting.

Five Given Study Grants

Grants for graduate study have been awarded five Nazareth College students.

Two of the top awards were made to Ellen Sullivan of Elmira, New York and Patricia Bellini of Long Island. Miss Sullivan will receive a \$2,900 grant plus all tuition and fees for a year's study in Speech Therapy at the University of Buffalo. Miss Bellini will receive a \$2,900 grant plus tuition and fees for graduate study in the Social Sciences at the University of Rochester. The grant is part of the Ford Foundation-sponsored Inter-University Program.

Rated by many as the top female vocalist, Ella Fitzgerald gives you a lot for this price in her latest "Jazz with Nelson Riddle and his orchestra. From her wholehearted exuberance Ella puts her whole heart as well as her voice into every note on Ella Swings Brightly With Nelson. Selections include I Won't Dance, Pick Yourself Up, Love Me Or Leave Me and I Hear Music. Excellent stereo definition. (Verve)

The John Young Trio offers some finger-snapping and toe-tapping music in their Argo release of Thees and Things. Fine listening.

The New Christie Minstrels Tell Tall Tales on their latest release from Columbia. Under the direction of Randy Sparks, the group adds some fun songs and nonsense rhymes to their repertoire. Fascinating sound from a fine group.

The Christie Minstrels TV Boss, Andy Williams, also has a new release out entitled Days of Wine and Roses and Other TV Requests. Light and pleasing. (Columbia)

Patrice Munsel's new recording, Unpredictable, is just that. A somewhat shallow and restrained performance. (Philips)

Jo Stafford and Paul Weston invite you to Sing Along With Jonathan and Darlene Edwards. The popularity of this couple in their previous records as an off-key vocalist and a sticky fingered accompanist has led to another fun-filled album of musical murder. Included this time is a laugh provoking chorus. A laugh a minute. Stereo version puts "Darlene" to the left, "Jonathan" to the right, and the chorus in the center. (Victor)

Eugene Ormandy conducts the Philadelphia Orchestra in a lush interpretation of Strauss waltzes and polkas in Carnival in Venice. Impressive throughout the vivid in stereo. (Columbia)

The Robert Shaw Choral exerts in a lively performance of 23 classical favorites on RCA Victor. A varied program of appealing music.

Curiosity got the best of me when I saw Audi-fidelity's record called Sound Effects—U.S. Air Force Firepower. It even includes a nuclear explosion. There are three useful purposes I've found for it—ideal background music for World War III, it can also be used to get rid of unwanted company or to make the house sound more normal when the kids are away at summer camp.
