Parade Highlights Memorial Week

The 95th Annual Sunday Memorial Service in the Shrine Room of Community War Memorial, Sunday May 26 at 3 p.m. will open the observance of Memorial Week and the street parade on Memorial Day, Thursday, May 30 starting at 10:30 p.m. will climax events.

Besides the many Catholic servicemen and women participating in the parade with their military units, Catholic organizations and bands will be in line according to Edward W. Schepherd, grand marshal.

LINE OF MARCH will be down East Ave. from Portsmouth Terrace to East Main St. to Plymouth Ave. south to Broad St. to South Ave. A brief service at Our War Memorial Building shrine will pay tribute to departed servicemen and women.

Nazareth Academy and Aquinas Institute bands will head the parade. In line also will be the Nazareth Falls Cadets, Knights of St. John and Ladies Auxiliaries, The Catholic War Veterans and CIVV Auxiliaries and Holy Cross Marching Band.

THE COMMENCEMENT will be preceded by the Mass of the Holy Spirit on Saturday, June 8, at 8:30 a.m. at St. Peter and Paul's Church with Bishop Kearney officiating.

Conway has been District Attorney of Monroe County since 1961. Prior to that he served as Assemblyman, 2nd Assembly District Monroe County (1957-1960).

Born in Cohoes, N.Y., Conway was graduated from Christian Brothers Academy, Albany, N.Y., Cornell University 1937 and Cornell Law School in 1940. He was Legal Assistant to Alger B. Chapman, President New York State Tax Commission, 1946-47; instructor in Law at the University of Rochester, 1947-57; in private practice of law from 1947-1960.

He is a member and former trustee Rochester Bar Association; Past Faithful Navigator of Rochester Assembly, Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus; member of Holy Name Society; Our Lady of Lourdes Church and Knights of Equity.

Conway resides at 21 Westland Avenue with his wife, former Mary Madden, a graduate of the University of Rochester and Cornell Law School, and their four children.

Fortieth Anniversary

Four priests of the Rochester Diocese will observe their fortieth anniversaries in the priesthood early in June.

The four are: Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Duffy, Rev. Howard Geck, Rev. John A. Guy and Rev. John C. O'Donnell.

Following are details of the anniversary observances and a brief biography of each priest:

MONSIGNOR DUFFY, pastor of St. Augustine's Church, Rochester, will celebrate an anniversary Mass in the parish church Sunday, June 9, at 11 a.m.

Rev. Walter E. Fleming will be deacon and Rev. Albert V. Ryan, subdeacon.

He will otherwise mark the anniversary privately.

Monsignor Duffy, born June 9, 1893, in Red Creek, N.Y., attended public schools in the village, Oswego Normal School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

He was ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rochester, by Bishop John Gregory Murray on June 9, 1923.

He served as curate at St. Anthony's Church, Rochester; taught at Aquinas Institute, curate at Holy Family Church, Auburn, diocesan superintendent of schools from 1929 to 1945 when he was named pastor.

FATHER GUY, pastor-emeritus of St. Paul of the Cross Church, Honeoye Falls, will mark his anniversary privately at St. Ann's Home, Rochester.

He retired from active pastoral duties last year.

Father Guy, a native of Rochester, attended St. Peter and Paul's school, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

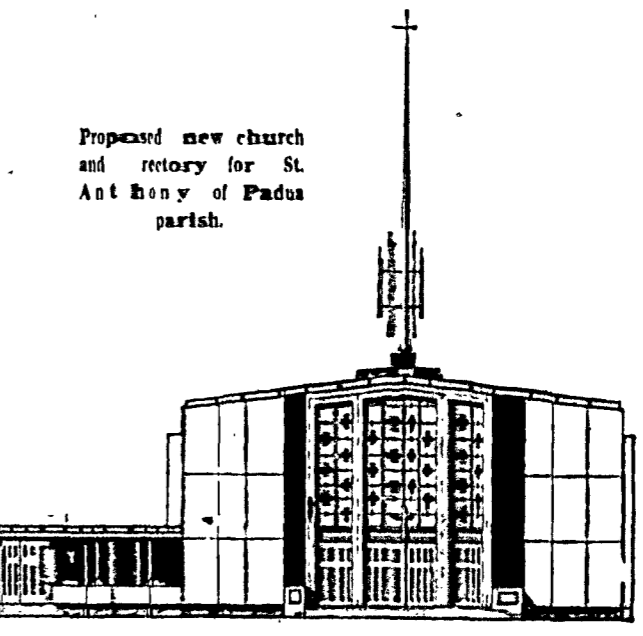
He was ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rochester, by Bishop John Gregory Murray on June 9, 1923.

He served as a curate at St. Michael's Church, Rochester, taught at St. Andrew's Seminary for 19 years and was chaplain at the Motherhouse of the Sisters of St. Joseph from 1929 to 1937. He was named to his pastorate in 1948.

FATHER GUY, pastor of St. Michael's Church, Honeoye Falls, and St. John's Church, Port Byron, will mark a double anniversary—40 years a priest and 25 years as pastor. His observance of the milestones will, however, be private.

He is a native of Clyde, attended schools there, St. An-

drew's and St. Bernard's Sem- of Auburn, attended St. Mary's school, Auburn Academic High School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.
He served as curate at St. Stephen's Church, Geneva, prior to his appointment as St. Mary's Church, Rochester, and St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop John Gregory Murray on June 9, 1923.
He did graduate studies at St. Bonaventure University, St. Bonaventure U. N. Y., Nazareth College and Columbia University.
He served as curate at Sacred Heart Church, Rochester, St. John's Church, Clyde, St. Patrick's, Elmira, taught nine years at Aquinas Institute and eight years at St. Andrew's Seminary. He was named pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Dansville, in 1945 and to his Perkinsville pastorate in 1950.
Father O'Donnell, born Dec. 4, 1893, is the son of the late Terrence and Mary O'Donnell.
