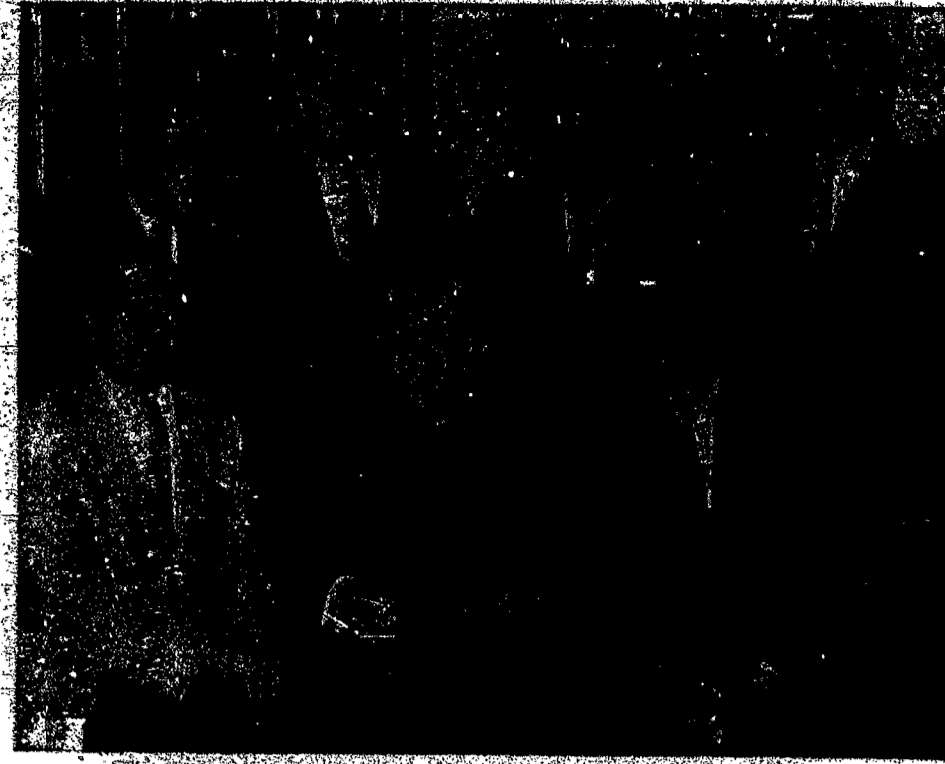

Slavic Saints Honored In Papal Statement

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope John XXIII has signed an Apostolic Letter commemorating the 1,000th anniversary of the arrival in Moravia of SS. Cyril and Methodius, Apostles of the Slavs.

The letter, entitled "Magnifici Eventus" (Of a Magnificent Event), was signed by the pontiff at the Vatican's Consistory Hall. The document was witnessed by bishops, cardinals, legation and papal nuncios from the Slavic countries.

Pope John's letter praised the actions of SS. Cyril and Methodius who came to Rome to ask permission to spread Christianity among the Bohemians, Moravians, Poles, Russians and other Slavs.

SS. Cyril and Methodius, the papal document said, "stood together as pillars and bonds of much desired union (with Rome)." They represent "the rocklike faith" with which the Slavic people have been united to Rome, it added.

The saints were brothers, born at Thessalonica, Greece, who began their evangelizing work in Moravia in 863. The labor met with opposition, and four and a half years later they were summoned to Rome, where Pope Adrian II commended their missionary activities.

Cyril did not return to Moravia, but died in Rome in 869. The Pope consecrated Metho-
