40 Per Cent Plan Teaching Careers

More than 40 per cent of the graduates of Nazareth College will take up positions in the teaching field next fall.

Of the other graduates, roughly 10 per cent will go into business and an equal number will be graduates of professional schools. Other students will seek careers in nursing (15%), federal and state government (5%), and science (5%). Three students will serve in the lay apostolate and three will enter the Sisters of St. Joseph order in September.

And, at last count, 10 of the graduates plan to be married within the near future.

One of the aspects of this year's graduating class is its tendency to roam far afield. Already Nazareth College is a leading supplier to local, state, and national schools in Florida, Texas, Washington, Louisiana and Washington, D.C.
