## Churchmen Exchange Ideas in Colombia

Bogota - (RNS) - In an unprecedented "dialogue" for predominantly Roman Catholic Colombia, 16 Protestant and 11 Catholic clergy and laymen gathered here for an "informal and friendly exchange of ideas on interreligious relations in this country." Details of the meeting were not announced, but it was reported that subjects discussed included evangelization of non-Christian religions and non-Christians, the problem of proselytism, and anti-Protestant and anti-Catholic literature. The meeting was held at the home of the Rev. Antonio C. Lopez, president of the Evangelical Lutheran Church-Colombia Synod. This body was formed from missionary work of the former Evangelical and United Evangelical Lutheran Churches in the U.S., now part of the American Lutheran Church. A leader of the Catholic program was Father Alfred Morin, rector of Bogota's archdiocesan Major Seminary, who invited Protestants to attend a similar meeting at his seminary. The priest also presented a major paper on Protestant-Catholic relations in Colombia. (In New York the meeting was called "especially noteworthy" by Dr. Stewart W. Horn, executive director of the Lutheran World Federation's Committee on Latin America. "This kind of contact," he said, "is occurring with increasing frequency all over Latin America, as I noted on my recent visit to Brazil, thanks largely to the change of climate in Rome because of Pope John XXIII's recognition of non-Roman Christians as separated brethren.")
