### 'Good' Seats Available For Elmira Water Show

Good reserved seat locations are still available for the fabulous "Aqua Spectacular" which comes to Elmira the last week-end of June. But, reservations for any of the six shows should be made early enough to avoid disappointment.

The "Aqua Spectacular" will be the highlight of the 8th Annual Notre Dame Fun Festival Friday, June 28; Saturday, June 29, and Sunday, June 30. Shows will be held each evening at 7 and 9:15 p.m. in the Notre Dame High School football stadium.

RESERVATIONS may be made at the Notre Dame Athletic Office; Pal's Sporting Goods; Chuck & Junker's; Mark's Cut Rate, Elmira Heights; and Winnick's Army & Navy Store, Horseheads.

The 2-hour show features a cast of 30, including 16 aqua-maids; champion Olympic divers and swimmers; acrobats and clowns in lavish production numbers.

The "Aqua Spectacular" cast just finished a highly successful 7-day stand June 10 at the Ohio State Fairground Coliseum.

Some of the featured performers are: Ronnie Munn, former University of Michigan and national trampoline champion who won the South African diving title in 1962; Eddie Cole, University of Michigan diving champ; Carol Ridings, former AAU synchronized swimming title holder; Swedish gymnast, Borje Barton; the dancing Taylor Twins; recording artist, Richard Hayman who is also the musical director; the Clown Princes of Aqua shows, Vic Zoble, former NYU swim coach.

The Aqua-maids hail from every corner of the world, including Ursula Crauser of Hamburg, Germany; Gigi Brosius of France, and Mary Kealy who recently won the title, "Miss Irish, U.S.A."

A show for the entire family, young and old will be delighted with four big production numbers: "Festive Spectacular," "Lake" ballet; the "Aqua Circus"; "Neptune's Mardi Gras," and "Swimwear Cavalcade."

The coronation group was preceded to the sanctuary by a procession of 50 kindergarten and first grade pupils wearing white dresses and white suits and carrying colonial bouquets. The procession was led by Christine Dodd and Catherine Hill.
