FIRST STEP toward the construction of an addition to the Nativity parochial school, Brockport, was taken Sunday, June 16. The site of the new school was blessed and a sign was placed identifying the property on Lawton Rd., Clarkson, one mile east of Lake Rd. Construction is to begin in the Spring of 1964 with the opening of the school scheduled September 1965. Five classrooms will be available at that time. Currently an appeal is being made to the members of the Nativity parish in Brockport to increase the Sunday collections to finance the expansion project. Parishioners will be contacted Sun-

Basilian Father Prince Appointed To Paris Post

The Rev. Raymond L. Prince, C.S.B., guidance counselor at Aquinas Institute and veteran teacher at the Catholic boys' high school, has been named rector of Maison St. Basil, the Basilian Fathers' house of studies in Paris, France.

THE APPOINTMENT was announced this week by the Very Rev. Joseph C. Wey, C.S.B., superior general of the Basilians. Father Prince will assume his new duties in Paris at the end of August. He has been on the Aquinas faculty for 24 years.
