**Nurses Receive Diplomas
In Golden Jubilee Class**

Hornell — The Golden Jubilee Class of St. James Mercy Hospital School of nursing received diplomas Sunday afternoon, June 16, in St. Ann's Church.

In recognition of the nursing school's 50th anniversary, commencement exercises included celebration of Mass by Bishop Kearney.

BISHOP KEARNEY also delivered the commencement address, imparted the Pontifical Blessing and conferred diplomas on 15 graduates of the School of Nursing and three from the School of X-Ray Technology.

Using Father Day as his theme, the Bishop told the graduates that one of the "great gifts" his Father could give is the knowledge that his hopes and prayers for his children have been realized with the completion of the preparation for a great vocation. He continued:

"Nursing is a great vocation because it typifies the two great commandments — love of God and love of neighbor. Each of you graduates has another Father, who regards you with affection and deep concern. It is especially appropriate that you receive your diplomas today in your Father's House.

"Jesus, His divine Son, present in the tabernacle, showed us the way when He said, 'If you ask Me, I will give it to you.' Bishop Kearney continued:

"His great prayer started not with an invocation of awe, such as 'O, Almighty God,' but with reverent affection, 'Our Father Who art in Heaven.'"

"Pray today that in times of difficulty and stress you always will turn for help to the One Who is always willing to hear from you. In your Father's House."

**Fisher Grant
To Benefit
Educational TV**

The Fund for the Advancement of Education has made a grant of \$3,470 to St. John Fisher College as agent for the public and private colleges and universities of this area. It was announced today by the Very Rev. Charles J. Lawry, C.S.B., President of St. John Fisher College.

THE GRANT has been made to enable the cooperating institutions, University of Rochester, R.I.T., Nazareth College, St. John Fisher College, Roberts Wesleyan College, Rochester Colgate Divinity School, State University College at Brockport, State University College at Geneseo and Monroe Community College, to employ consultants to present plans for the use of educational television for instructional purposes in the Rochester area.

The consultants will advise the presidents of the colleges on the possibilities of closed circuit television in addition to open channel television.

The nine institutions of the Rochester area completed a study this year under the direction of the State Education Department in Albany on the possibilities of inter-institutional cooperation. Educational television is one of the subjects of immediate interest and study.

The State Education Department has made plans for an Educational Television system which will run ultimately from New York to Buffalo and with connections for various areas. Rochester has priority in this regard. The plans of the colleges and universities will work in harmony with the plans of RAETA for coverage in this area.

The Fund for Advancement of Education was established by the Ford Foundation.

The first American flag at the new St. Ann's Home will be raised by American Legion Post 1501 in ceremonies Friday (today) commemorating the first flying of the original 13 stars and stripes.

THE ADMINISTRATION and guests of St. Ann's Home and members of American Legion Post 1501 will participate in the flag raising ceremony at 7:30 p.m. June 21 at the Home. The flag is a gift to St. Ann's from the post.

Herbert Muhs, 373 Woodcroft Drive, Greece, commander of Post 1501, and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Arthur E. Ratigan, director of Catholic Charities, will speak about 60 guests of the home will witness the program.

The first American flag of 13 stars and 13 stripes was flown in June, 1777, in the Revolutionary War.

To the music of "To the Color," the post color guard will raise the flag and lower it to half-mast in remembrance of America's war dead. It will then be raised again and taken down and presented to Sister M. Thelma, administrative of St. Ann's Home.

After remarks by Commander Muhs and Msgr. Ratigan, Sister M. Thelma will preside.
