

New Philosophy Course Offered At Fisher

A newly designed course in Philosophy is being offered during this summer's Nazareth-Fisher Summer Session. Entitled "Contemporary Culture and Its Philosophical Aspects," the course will be given by Rev. Robert G. Miller, C.S.B., chairman of the Philosophy Department at St. John Fisher College. The course will be held in the Philosophy Department building on the campus of St. John Fisher College, Roseton, N.Y., from 8:30 to 9:10 and may be taken either on a credit or a non-credit basis.

Since each type of humanism or culture involves an entire metaphysics, this course will analyze the metaphysical roots of an authentic Christian humanism and the roots of the varieties of pseudo and pseudo-Christian humanism. Special attention will be given to the impact of metaphysical positions about the existence and nature of God upon such cultural areas as the fine arts, law and authority, racial justice, public and private education, economic, juridical and religious pluralism and civil toleration.

THE METAPHYSICS of personality will be coordinated with the metaphysics of knowledge as to understand the influence of science and technology in culture and the significance of work, automation, leisure time and private property in relation to the demands of human artistic creativity.

New Category Listed By Legion

New York — (AP) — The National Legion of Decency has dropped the "Separate Classification" and replaced it with a new category known as "Class A-1" for motion pictures which are evaluated as "morally objectionable for adults — with reservations."

The legion emphasized that the change from "Separate Classification" to the "Class A-1" classification is one of "deletion" not of "meaning."

The legion said the new category, like the "Separate Classification" all for "certain films which, while not morally offensive in themselves, require caution and some analysis and explanation as a protection to the uninitiated against wrong interpretation and false conclusions."

In recent years, the legion evaluated 28 motion pictures in the "Separate Classification." Among the more prominent of these movies were: "Anatomy of a Murder," "Case of Dr. Lauriat," "Dances with Wolves," "The King of Kings," "Dolce Vita," "Lolita," "The Day's Journey Into Night," "Pressure Point," "The Sky Above and the Mud Below," "Summer of '42," "The Young Man with a Sideburn," and "The Young Man with a Sideburn."
