**Awards Given At McQuaid**

Twenty-four McQuaid High School seniors received special awards for citations at Wednesday evening's graduation exercises held at Eastman Theater.

Jan Yutzy of 86 Danbury Circle South, Brighton, valedictorian of the 100-man class, was singled out for honors on eight occasions. Yutzy, who will attend Boston College, took the gold medal for general excellence with his four-year average of 96.15. He also won individual awards for highest average in religion, mathematics, and history, as well as the Busch and Lomb Award for outstanding achievement as promise in science.

YUTZY WAS also cited as a National Merit Finalist and McQuaid's top scorer in the 1963 contest held by the Mathematics Association of America. His final mention came as one of McQuaid's nineteen scholarship winners over and above New York State Regents grants. In addition to his Boston College scholarship, he received honorary scholarships to Holy Cross and Georgetown.

Runner-up to Yutzy for academic laurels was Richard Spies of 21 Babcock Drive, Brighton, who won the silver medal for general excellence with an average of 95.42 and the Latin prize for highest average. Spies was also honored by the McQuaid student body in senior week activities when he received the "Knight of the Year" trophy. Like Yutzy, he was a National Merit Finalist.

**Fisher Grant To Benefit Educational TV**

The Fund for the Advancement of Education has made a grant of \$3,470 to St. John Fisher College as agent for the nine public and private colleges and universities of this area. It was announced today by the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, C.S.B., President of St. John Fisher College.

THE GRANT has been made to enable the cooperating institutions, University of Rochester, R.I.T., Nazareth College, St. John Fisher College, Roberts Wesleyan College, Rochester College, State University College at Brockport, State University College at Geneseo and Monroe Community College, to employ consultants to present plans for the use of educational television for instructional purposes in the Rochester area.

The consultants will advise the presidents of the colleges on the possibilities of closed circuit television in addition to open channel television.

The nine institutions of the Rochester area completed study this year under the direction of the State Education Department in Albany on the possibilities of inter-institutional cooperation. Educational television is one of the subjects of immediate interest and study.

The State Education Department has made plans for an Educational Television system which will run ultimately from New York to Buffalo and with connections for various areas. Rochester has priority in this regard. The plans of the colleges and universities will work in harmony with the plans of N.Y.S.T.V. for coverage in this area.

The Fund for Advancement of Education was established by the Ford Foundation.

**Fisher Grant To Benefit Educational TV**

The first American flag at the new St. Ann's Home will be raised by American Legion Post 1501 in ceremonies Friday (today) commemorating the first flying of the original 13 stars and stripes.

THE ADMINISTRATION and guests of St. Ann's Home and members of American Legion Post 1501 will participate in the Flag Day Ceremony at 77 p.m. June 21 at the home. The flag is a gift to St. Ann's from the post.

Herbert Muhs, 373 Woodcroft Drive, Greece commander of Post 1501, and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Arthur E. Ratigan, director of Catholic Charities, will speak about 60 guests of the home will witness the program.

The first American flag of 13 stars and 13 stripes was flown in June, 1777, in the Revolutionary War.

To the music of "To the Colors," the post color guard will raise the flag and lower it to half-mast in remembrance of America's war dead. It will then be raised again and taken down and presented to Sister M. Thomasina, administrator of St. Ann's Home.

After remarks by Commander Muhs and Msgr. Ratigan, Sister Thomasina will return the flag to the color guard which will raise it once more.

THE CEREMONY at St. Ann's will be the initial activity of Post 1501 in the American Legion's Monroe County Convention, which began officially Saturday, June 15. Post 1501 has 100 members, most of them World War II veterans. It is located at 1550 Clinton Ave. North.

St. Ann's Home is owned by the Rochester Diocese, directed by Catholic Charities, operated by the Sisters of St. Joseph, and open to persons of all races and creeds.
