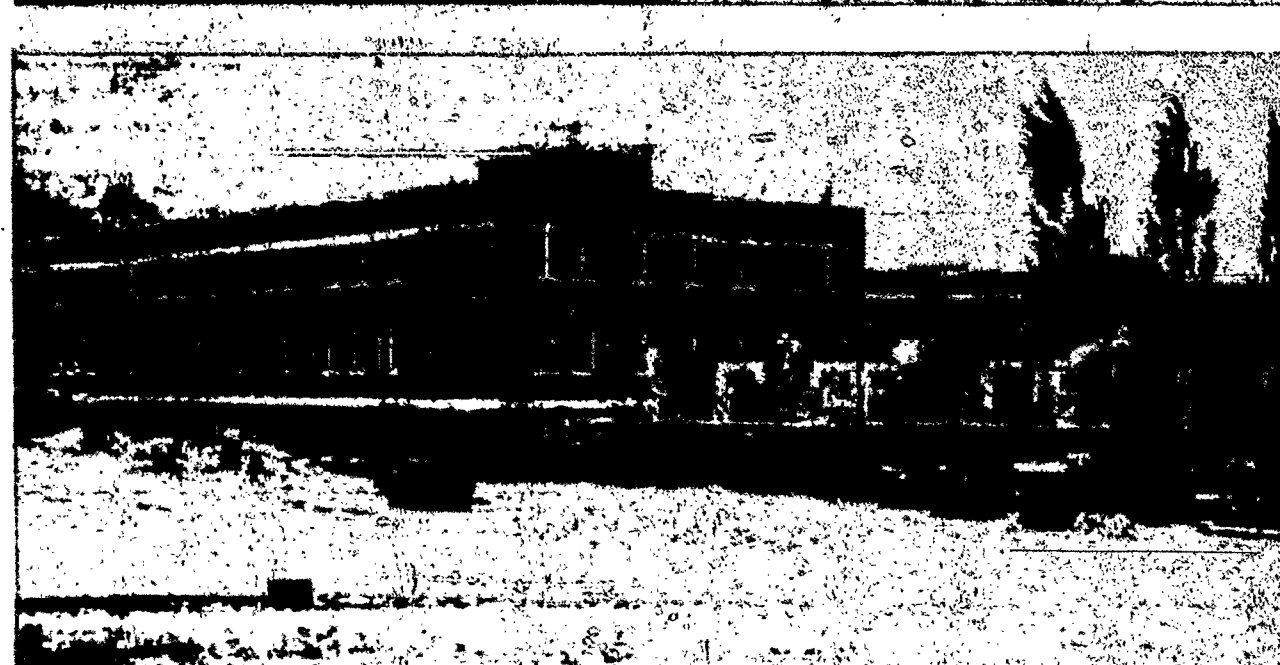
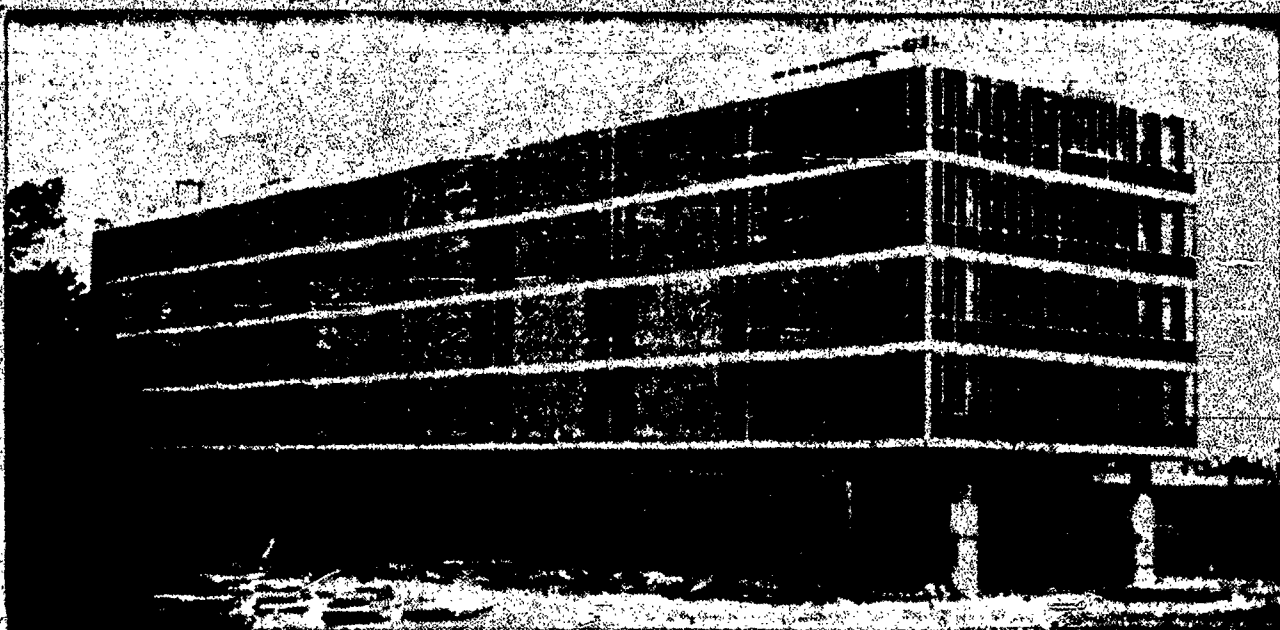


College Expansion In Diocese

Mother Helene Named To Direct Young Nuns

Mother M. Helene, S.S.J., will assume the office of Mistress of Junior Religious of the Sisters of St. Joseph within the next few weeks. Mother Helene's appointment was announced by Reverend Mother Agnes Cecilia yesterday.

The newly appointed Mistress of Junior Religious has just completed a second term of office as Mother General. In this capacity she has long been interested in the movement within the Church to expand and strengthen the Juniorate. She brings to her new office extraordinary talent and rich experience.

HER APPOINTMENT marks the next step in the development of the Sister Formation Program for the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Diocese of Rochester. Mother Helene will foster the intellectual, cultural and spiritual lives of the young religious.

The outstanding characteristics of Mother Helene's term as Mother General have been initiative and courage. Her first concern resulted in the establishment of her community as a Pontifical Congregation.

Her administrative ability has been evident in various projects carried on by the community: the expansion programs under way at St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira; a library, two dormitories and a faculty house on the Nazareth College campus; the new St. Agnes High School on East River Road.

She has directed the construction of new convents in the Diocese and staffed new schools including the public section of Mount Carmel High School in Auburn. She also appointed the administrative personnel and nursing staff of the recently constructed St. Ann's Home.
