Jackie Wilson and Linn Colpix combine for an outstanding rendition of some of the most popular gospel music on a new Brunswick record, "I'm Striving Hard," which will surely set your feet tapping in this impressive performance on Shiloh as home. Excellent support is also given by the chorus and orchestra, conducted by Alan Jacobs on two songs and by Dick Jacobs on the remaining ten. Compelling from the beginning to end, the record includes Joshua Fit the Battle of Jericho, He's Got the Whole World in His Hands, Shake a Hand, When the Saints Go Marching In, Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen, Yes in Deed, Oh Time Religion, Evening Time I Feel the Spirit, Dry Bones, Down by the Riverside, Oh Lord, and Swing Low, Sweet Chariot. A fascinating collection of songs with a top-notch performance. Fine use of stereo.

A fine recording, New Thresholds in Sound was produced by RCA Victor to show off its new Dynagroove recording technique. With the orchestra conducted by Sid Ramin, a showcase of sound was recorded with excellent utilization of stereo. Impressive sound throughout. You'll play this one often both for yourself and for your friends. Twelve fine songs including April in Paris, Swano and Bewitched.

Steve Lawrence sings some winners on his new release for Columbia. The "winners" aren't all his (Andy Williams' Moon River, Frank Sinatra's All the Way, etc.) but Steve does justice to all of them including his own "winner"—Go Away Little Girl. Pope Replies To Nikita, Polish Chief

Vatican City—(RNS)—Pope Paul VI has sent messages to the leaders of Communist Russia and Poland, stating the Roman Catholic Church's concern for international peace.

Both communications were in reply to congratulatory messages received by the new pontiff from Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev and Aleksander Zawadzki, president of Poland's Council of State and titular head of that country.

The message to Mr. Khrushchev was given wide publicity by Tass, Soviet news agency in Moscow, and that to Mr. Zawadzki by the official Polish Press Agency in Warsaw.

The Pope's messages were seen here by some observers as a continuation of the late Pope John XXIII's efforts to improve Vatican contacts with leaders behind the Iron Curtain.

Polish Communist Party leader Wladyslaw Gombocz said that in this direction was taken by John XXIII last March when he granted an audience to Alexei A. Adzhubel, editor of the Russian newspaper, Izvestia, and son-in-law of Premier Khrushchev.
