**French Dominican's Comment**  
**Papal Primacy Reunion Block**

Portland, Ore. — (NC) — The major obstacle in the path of Christian reunion is "the question of the primacy of the Roman pontiff and papal infallibility," an English Dominican from a French ecumenical center said here.

"It is the only really grave problem for both Protestants and Orthodox," said Father Thomas Cowley, from the French institute Istina, near Paris.

An attempt to overcome the obstacle has been presentation of the idea of the pontiff as a "servant to Christianity rather than domination of it," he said.

At the same time, Father Cowley stated, the presence of Russian Orthodox observers at the Second Vatican Council may be a "presence of better relationships between Catholics and the extremely important Patriarch of Moscow."

"Paradoxically enough, the Patriarch of Moscow is more independent of the state now than ever in the past," he said, adding that of all Non-Catholic churches, the Russian Orthodox comes nearest to the Catholic in beliefs and practices.

The Vatican Council had an effect on Non-Catholics' understanding of the primacy of the pope, Father Cowley continued.

"They saw ecclesiastical democracy at work. There was no attempt to impose a pre-conceived solution of any question before the Council," he said.

Father Cowley, an Anglican priest before he became a Catholic and Dominican in 1957, said "the most remarkable" result of Pope John XXIII's reign was the "tremendous advance in Catholic and Protestant relations" which "would have been almost inconceivable five years ago."

He said Pope Paul VI might be expected to continue "the ecumenical opening of Pope John and an even more lively policy toward the pastoral and missionary cities which face us," in racial problems and for human rights. I am sure this was the thinking of Pope John and Cardinal Bea," he said.

Growing together in "fraternal charity" will bring all with immediate cooperation of Catholics, Orthodox and Protestants in a "struggle of charity for world peace, to an already established," he said.

Washington — (NC) — An eight-point legislative program designed to liberalize the U.S. immigration laws has been introduced by Sen. Jacob K. Javits of New York.

Cosponsors of the measure, which Javits said would "end our piecemeal approach to immigration reform" and correct a policy which "has produced an incredible epic of broken lives" are: Sens. Kenneth B. Keating, New York; Wayne I. Morse, Oregon; Everett Salloustan, Massachusetts; Clifford P. Case, New Jersey, and Hugh Scott, Pennsylvania.
