

Priests Need Prelate's OK For Protests

Baltimore — (RNS) — Parish priests in the Archdiocese of Baltimore must have specific permission to participate in future demonstrations against racial segregation, Archbishop Lawrence J. Shehan has ordered.

A spokesman for the archdiocese said:

"The archbishop has directed that priests desiring to participate in future demonstrations should in each case seek specific permission so that the promotion of racial justice and the preservation of the common good can be simultaneously assessed in each case."

The directive was announced because of rumors that priests had been forbidden to participate in future protests. This was flatly denied by the spokesman.

Several priests were arrested in demonstrations against the ban of Negroes from Gwynn Oak Amusement Park, just outside Baltimore.

Race Tensions An Opportunity

Jackson, Miss. — (NC) — A Catholic pastor said here that current racial tensions create a "providential opportunity" for progress.

Msgr. Joseph G. Chatham, pastor of St. Richard church, predicted in a sermon that "when the good people of our southland grasp the moral issues involved in the racial justice question, 'harmful, legalized, enforced segregation will be no more.'"

"Under God's grace a climate of freedom shall be developed in which free men move freely and live with becoming dignity as children of God and free Americans," he said.

Pupils' Rights Under Fire

Cleveland — (NC) — The question of rights of children in parochial schools has erupted in three area communities.

In Chesterland, the public school board received a petition signed by 2,107 voters asking that public school buses transport children to St. Anselm Parochial school which will open in the fall. After a short but stormy session, the board tabled the request until its August 13 meeting.

In Medina, a request that the school board lease buses — for pay — to St. Francis Xavier parish was originally turned down by the board and now is headed for a ruling by Ohio Atty. Gen. William B. Saxbe.

The moves in both areas were pressed by parents with the par-

ish officials taking no official stand.

The school board of the third community Eastlake, has been asked to permit the one-year-old St. Justin Martyr parish to use two classrooms during the coming school year — until the parish opens its own school in 1964.

The board told Father Victor Lambur, St. Justin pastor, it would consider the request.

The Medina School Board turned down the request for leasing of buses on the grounds that it would be illegal.

transporting of private school pupils, was legal. The question now has been turned over to the state attorney general.

The Chesterland parents' committee has been working since May gathering signatures to a petition urging the school board to provide bus transportation for all school children, as a matter of public safety and general welfare.

The committee is headed by Joseph E. Kall, instructor of history and political science at Notre Dame College for Women here.

School board president Fred Prasse questioned the committee's motives and methods and the manner in which it gathered the signatures.

Vatican Honors Moscow Prelate On Jubilee

Vatican City — (NC) — Pope Paul VI, responding to an invitation of the Russian Orthodox Church, has authorized sending two representatives to Moscow to mark the 50th anniversary of the episcopal consecration of Patriarch Alexei of Moscow.

The invitation was sent by the Holy Synod of the Russian Orthodox Church. The two representatives of the Catholic Church were chosen and authorized by Augustin Cardinal Bea, S.J., President of the Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity.

The representatives are Bishop Francois Chevriere of Lausanne, Geneva and Yverburg, Switzerland, and Father Christophe Dumont, O.P., director of the Dominican Fathers' Istina Center in Paris.

The jubilee observances cover the period from July 14 to 21. The sites are in Moscow and at the Holy Trinity Monastery outside the Russian capital.
