### Ithaca Nun to Found School in Lima, Peru

Sister Christine Mary, GNSH, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Mariano deYeaza, 227 South Geneva St., Ithaca, is one of four Grey Nuns of the Sacred Heart who will establish a school for poor children in Lima, Peru.

SISTER CHRISTINE MARY is the former Mary Christina deYeaza. She attended Ithaca Senior High School and St. Norbert's School in Rochester. She is a graduate of P. Youville College in Buffalo and the past year taught at St. Rose of Lima School in Buffalo.

The four are the first Grey Nuns to serve in South America. The establishment of the mission school in Lima is in accordance with the late Pope John's request that all religious orders send 10 per cent of their members to south America over the next ten years. The school, which is presently being constructed, will be called St. Norbert's School. The Norbertine Fathers conduct a parish there. Sister Christine Mary and the other three sisters will leave the Grey Nuns' motherhouse in Philadelphia at a departure ceremony on Aug. 25. They will first go to Ponce, Puerto Rico, where they will attend the Catholic University, speaking Spanish and studying the customs and history of the Peruvians. They will leave for Peru on Dec. 10.
