Stephen C. Bartley, son of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Bartley, 7 Papert Place was honored by the Federal Government with an award of \$425 at a directors' conference at the Marshall Space Flight Center, Huntsville, Alabama. The award was made for "superior performance as Security Space Chief."

The award was made by Dr. Werner Von Braun head of the United States Space Program. In making the award and presenting the citation, Dr. Von Braun spoke highly of Bartley's leading role in the Security investigations which have been accomplished.

Bartley, 38, is an Old St. Mary's School boy. He was born in Cork City, Ireland, attended Monroe High School, the University of Pittsburgh and Syracuse University from which he was graduated in 1949.

He has a sister, Sister Mary Ann-Bar of the Sisters of Mercy and three brothers, Jack, Bernard, Herbert, all of Rochester.
