

Vatican Invites

Dr. Stuber Jefferson City, Mo. — An invitation to again attend the Second Vatican Council as a special guest of the Vatican Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity has been accepted by Dr. Stuber, I. S. Stuber, executive director of the Missouri Council of Churches.

HE SAID Augustin Cardinal Bea, president of the Secretariat, has renewed the invitation which took him to Rome for the first sessions of the Council. Dr. Stuber, a member of the American Baptist Convention, will have official status as an observer at the Council but will represent neither the denomination nor the Missouri Council of Churches. He said he intends to visit Spain before going to Rome for the resumption of Council sessions on Sept. 29.

Orangemen OK Bus Rides

Harrisburg, Pa. — (AP) — Thirteen Protestant ministers have backed a bill to provide tax-paid school bus rides for parochial and other private school pupils. They said in a letter to Gov. William Scranton that they believe it would be "for the welfare of the state" if the bill is enacted. The statement differs radically from a broad condemnation of the bill and its purpose made earlier by the Pennsylvania Council of Churches.

The 13 ministers said that if the state deems tax-paid bus rides vital for public school children, then children attending parochial schools "should not be discriminated against because of their religious creed."

Governors Want Prayer Back

Miami Beach, Fla. — (NC) — An appeal to Congress to clarify the right of U.S. public schools to have "free and voluntary participation in prayer" was issued by the national conference of governors here.

SUSPENDING their rules against passing resolutions, the state executives supported by a 251-1 vote the proposal of Gov. John H. Reed of Maine, which was described by its author as "in no way critical of the U.S. Supreme Court" for voiding present laws on school prayers. The lone dissenter was Gov. Karl F. Rolvaag of Minnesota.

Bp. Neumann

Vatican City — (NC) — The beatification of Bishop John Neumann of Philadelphia (and a pioneer priest in Rochester) has been tentatively scheduled for October 13, it was disclosed here by Father Nicholas B. Ferrante, C.S.S.R., postulator of his cause.

He said that although the date has not yet been officially announced by the Sacred Congregation of Rites, he has informed Archbishop John J. Krol of Philadelphia that October 13 will be the date. The beatification of Bishop Neumann was originally scheduled for June 23 but had to be postponed because of the final illness of Pope John XXIII.

'Anything Goes' Listed At T and C Musicals

Starring movie veteran Andy Devine, an updated version of Cole Porter's Anything Goes will be Town & Country Musicals' presentation Aug. 6-11, in the air-conditioned East Rochester High School theater.

Most of the action of Anything Goes takes place aboard a trans-Atlantic steamship. A well-to-do American stockbroker impulsively stows away on the ship. Having neither ticket, coat nor passport, he accepts the aid of a self-effacing clergyman, who turns out to be a fugitive in disguise. The hilarity of the plot goes into high when the stockbroker discovers the passport he has borrowed belongs to Public Enemy No. 1, who missed the boat. This forces him to dash in and out of a series of shipboard madhouses of fun.

THE SHOW is famous for having in its song-book some of Cole Porter's most famous ditties—"You're the Top," "I Get a Kick Out of You," "Blow, Gabriel, Blow," "All Through the Night" and "The Gypsy in Me."
